

The CRD has now worked out all the bugs for posting our monthly agenda on the website. For this reason, no printed copies will be available at our monthly meetings. Residents that plan to attend will have at least three options to obtain copies. You can request a printed copy at the rec center office on the day of the meeting, while it is open from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. You can access the agenda at the website while it is posted and print a copy for yourself. Or, if you have a laptop, tablet or other internet accessible device, you can access the agenda online during the meeting. The agenda will be posted by Saturday evening before each meeting, and will be removed by Tuesday evening after each meeting.

At our June meeting we welcomed Bryan Huls from the CCA, who informed us that a number of complaints have been received by the CCA about unsafe boating practices on Lake Carroll, in some cases by our own residents. In order to better inform residents (and non-residents), both Boards will be taking some proactive measures over the summer, such as inviting Florida Fish and Wildlife out to the lake, sending letters to residents that are observed practicing unsafe boating, and publishing safety articles to remind boaters of the requirements for safe boating on Lake Carroll.

We also voted on and approved the budget for the upcoming fiscal year. In anticipation of possible savings on interest on our debt, we budgeted a significant amount for capital improvements. At the same meeting we voted on the bids we received from the various banks and decided to accept the offer from SunTrust Bank, therefore staying with our current lender. After weighing the options the Board decided that the offer from SunTrust best fit the needs of a small governmental agency that basically lives on a fixed income.

We expect that Treasurer Cary Brown will have signed off on the new loan terms by the time you read this. Once the new loan is locked in, a significant portion of the cash reserves held by the Board for future debt service will be freed up to finance the improvements we approved in the budget.

At Scotty Cooper Park, we budgeted to replace the existing chain link fence with decorative aluminum fencing, similar to what will be at the rec center by the time this article is published. We also included funding for new grills and picnic tables that were already under consideration by the prior Board.

At Original Carrollwood Park, funds were budgeted to install and secure a parking lot near the dog park, improve the fencing and therefore the security, and install workout stations around the walking path.

For this coming year, we also plan to landscape Duck Island with new materials that should almost eliminate future maintenance costs, and at the same time improve the appearance for the residents in the area. The reduction in maintenance costs means this should be a very good investment for the community.

White Sands Beach is slated to receive a new erosion control structure on the swim side, a project that was also in the works by the prior (continued on Page 7)



• Lake Carroll's approximate volume is nearly 1.1 million gallons.*



• Lake Carroll is monitored by 20 sampling locations which have collected a total of 48,004 samples ranging from June 1965 to April 2013. "Sampling locations" means volunteers go to these certain places every month to collect water samples to submit for water quality testing and research.*

• There are more than 50 species of freshwater crayfish in Florida. We found this one on our beach on Lake Carroll in May. It was about 1 ½ inches long and a reddish color. I think it is a Procambarus Clarkii, commonly known as a Red Swamp Crayfish. If anyone knows for sure, please share your knowledge.

Lake Carroll Update

We have had much rain in the past month, so I wanted to pass along an update from the Southwest Florida Water Management District aka SWFWMD.

As of June 11th Lake Carroll was over 37' NGVD (Elevations determined using the North American Vertical Datum 88). All stop logs are out and the carp barrier is in place (this means we are allowing water to exit Lake Carroll while keeping our Carp in place). Based on the lake's "flashiness" or fast reaction to storms, SWFWMD will be managing the lake to maintain storage when possible, and will try to maintain between 36.0 and 36.5 during the rainy season with the goal of topping it off around 36.7 as we approach the end of the rainy season.





SELLING YOUR HOME 101 APPRAISAL/VALUE

When housing prices began their great fall in 2008 there also became the fallout that accompany these issues. Immediately, everyone at fault begins to look for scapegoat. The appraisal industry is one of the first to take the heat. Consequently, the survivors become paranoid and begin to be much more aggressive with their research. The end result has been that in this appreciating marketplace we are experiencing many appraisals coming in below contract prices. What does this mean? Well in simple terms, the seller either has to lower his price or the buyer has to come up with extra money. For example: A buyer offers a seller 200,000 for a home with 20% down and 80% financing. This means the buyer has \$40,000 cash and the Mortgage Company will have \$260,000 to loan. But if the appraisal comes in at \$180,000 the mortgage company will only loan \$144,000 meaning the buyer has to come up with and additional \$16,000 cash or the seller has to reduce his price by \$20,000. Experience teaches us that most buyers will not come up with more cash. If the seller walks away, then he'll be faced with probably the same situation if another offer comes in. You must be sure that you have received good comparisons for your property before it goes on the

market and your Realtor should be able to do that. He/ she should then be able to show the appraiser how the seller arrived at their price. This doesn't mean that the appraiser will use any of this data but it does help since many appraisers are not always familiar with the specific locale, which is critical to Carrollwood residents.

And finally, we are down to just 4 homes left on the market and each has been on the market for over 150 days.

Their ground breaking investigation used data from Sunpass records to document widespread and dangerous off-duty speeding by South Florida police officers.

Boating Safety Focus of Saturday Gathering at White Sands Beach

A group of 27 Lake Carroll residents gathered at White Sands Beach on Sat. Jun. 15, 2013, for an informal discussion and vessel safety checks with members of the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary. They reviewed boating safety tips, discussed required emergency equipment for vessels and talked about navigation rules, safe speeds on Lake Carroll, and that paddle boards of any length are considered regulated vessels. They also shared that underwater hazards or floating debris could cause unforeseen accidents on any body of water. Attendees of all ages agreed the review was worthwhile, and that safe boating was a lakeside community concern.

"We've had some boating safety concerns and felt ongoing discussions could promote awareness,"

Lake Carroll resident Carolyn Ure concurred.

— Bryan Huls, Lake Committee Chair for the Carrollwood Civic Association. "The whole family benefitted by attending," she said. Ure attended along

attended al with her husband and two sons, and received a vessel sticker following a thorough vessel exam and safety discussion.

"The most important thing we learned is that the boating rules are the same whether you are boating on the bay or on a private lake," she said. "Now that we know Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission can stop you on Lake Carroll, we will be prepared."

Auxiliarists also reminded the group that:

- they must have a United States Coast Guard-approved life jacket for each person aboard. For Florida state regulations, log on to: http://www.boat-ed.com/fl/ handbook/pfds.htm
- children under six-years-old must wear a life vest at all times, according to Florida law
- ensure the boat driver is sober at all times
- current vessel documentation and properly displayed registration numbers
- fire extinguishers
- sound producing devices (whistle, air horns)

- dry towels and a blanket
- dry clothing and shoes
- first aid kit

Planning and preparation were emphasized as key components to safety on the water, whether on a lake or open water. While attendees seemed familiar and comfortable with safety gear, all agreed a similar discussion could benefit all boaters in our community.

"Thank you to all for scheduling that informative boating safety meeting," said Ure. "We hope you will do this every year. Our special thanks to all the nice Coast Guard guys who came to help out," she said.






CRD Budget Approved

On June 10, the CRD Board of Trustees approved a budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2013. Boating Safety on Lake Carroll and at White Sands Beach

I want to take the opportunity this month to write about boating laws, courtesy and safety. I've had many residents approach me with concerns about boating safety on our lake, and I myself have witnessed dangerous safety violations out there. I am hopeful many of these incidents are because folks may not know the rules, and so. I certainly hope this article is helpful.

All OC residents that wish to gain access to Lake Carroll must register their vessel with the CRD. When you complete the registration form you are agreeing to the CRD Rules and Regulations for White Sands Beach Boating, as well as, Florida's recreational boating requirements. The CRD reserves the right to suspend access privileges if and when any of these regulations are broken.

When the lake is busy the most important rule is to drive counter clockwise around Lake Carroll. Other than that specific rule, we follow Florida boating laws. The Florida's Recreational Boating Requirements lays out all rules and aspects of boating. It covers everything from vessel registration to water ski regulations. Specifically, it states "The operator of a vessel towing a skier may not pull the skier close enough to a fixed object or another vessel that there may be risk of collision."

The standard ski rope is 75 feet long. For safe boating practice, this should be interpreted as a MINIMUM of 75 feet distance from other vessels and/or fixed objects such as docks. This distance should be maintained at all times, and if you are not this far away then you are in violation of this regulation. Of course, it is much safer to maintain at least double that distance to ensure the safety of all parties. Awareness and caution can go a long way past just observing the law, and will help ensure the safety of everyone on the water.

Here are a few things to remember:

When the lake is busy:

- Always drive counter clockwise it is a Lake Carroll rule
- If there are a lot of boats pulling skiers and tubers just wait a few minutes until they are done. It will ease the traffic and make it safer on the lake
- Never follow directly behind another boat pulling a skier or tuber

When the lake is not busy:

- Give ample room to others trying to ski use another portion of the lake
- Give ample room to fisherman and drifting boats trying to relax

Remember – counter clockwise and keep your distance when possible.

We are lucky to have a very family friendly lake and recreation area as part of our neighborhood I know many of our residents are concerned about the safety of their children on the lake and at the beach. When kids and family members are involved in these types of violations, it can be terribly frightening. I hope this article will help keep us boating safely, while also having fun all summer long!


