White Sands Beach Chairman, Kevin Shidler, reported that the new decals and keys for the boat ramp will be available for purchase AFTER January 15, 2021. The new decals will not expire until October 2023. The cost remains the same as in previous years at \$45.00, payable to the C.R.D. We accept cash, check, or credit/debit card (yes - we are finally automated). Due to COVID, please print the application forms from the website and fill them out PRIOR to going to the business office, along with your driver's license and current boat & trailer registrations (all addresses are required to match, along with the home address listed on the property appraiser's website). If there is any discrepancy, then it will require Board review & approval, so the decal and key will-not be issued at your

office visit. If you would like Janet to email the forms to you, please call or email her PRIOR to your office visit. There is no rush to get there on the first day. Janet is in the office daily Monday through Thursday from 1:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m., and Friday's from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The lock change will occur closer to the end of March.

Also, a resident in attendance asked if and when there would be a future tax increase. Mike Carelli, board member and financial advisor, indicated that we will have to address this issue within 5-7 years, and we should start planning for it now. Since we have a hard dollar cap and not an inflation-adjusted cap like social security, for example, this is an issue we will have to revisit every 15-20 years or so as costs for all of our basic services increase. The last time we raised taxes was in 2004, so we are due to start the discussion.

# Inzredients:

- 1/2 cup powdered sugar

- A pinch of salt
- Optional: 1 cup chopped pecans

#### Directions:

- Preheat oven to 350°.
- Blend softened butter with powdered sugar using an electric hand mixer.
- Add vanilla extract, then add the dry ingredients : flour and salt (and chopped pecans if using)
- Form dough into small balls and place on prepared cookie sheet.
- Bake for 20 minutes until golden edges appear
- Remove the cookies from oven and top with powdered sugar.



Special thanks to resident Kristy Taylor for organizing the elves.



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
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#### REAL ESTATE 101: FACTORS TO CONSIDER FOR 2021 MARKET PREDICTIONS

2 020 has been a year of unexpected turns. It has also taught us to expect the unexpected. In regards to the housing market, there will always be buyers out there that want and/or need to buy a house. Analysts

have stated that through the end of the year, the housing market will be a key driver in economic recovery. However, none of us have a crystal ball, so it is nearly impossible to predict what 2021 has in store.

It is also impossible to compare today's economy to the 2008 recession. Loose lending practices and the increase in subprime mortgages pushed real estate prices to unsustainable levels. This caused banks to fail, resulting in mortgage default that led the feds to intervene in the foreclosure market in 2008. By 2010, 2.8 million foreclosures were filed.

Unlike in 2008, the mortgage eligibility requirements are stricter. Most mortgage lenders have increased the minimum credit score by 100 points or more compared to 2008, and are requiring a 10% to 20% down payment of the purchase price to reduce the borrower's debtto-income ratio.

The fed signals near-zero interest rates to lift the economy from the pandemic through 2023. Jerome Powell, Chair of the Federal Reserve, stated, "We expect to maintain the current 0%-0.25% target range for the federal funds rate... through 2023." According to Buffini's Bold Predictions for 2021 Real Estate Market Outlook:

- Home sales are predicted to rise by 5% 10%
- Job recovery continues with record-low mortgage rates.
- There is a new demand arising from remote-working flexibility.
- Prices are expected to rise by 3% 5%.

More vaccine availability equates to faster job growth combined with favorable mortgage rates. This has transpired from more work from home flexibility driving demand for larger homes and decentralization in suburban areas. Buyers were buying second homes a year ago, and now they are beginning to live in their second homes.

2020 brought many layoffs to non-essential workers. In spite of this, if you were laid off in 2020 and are rehired this year, you are likely to be approved as long as you meet all other lender requirements. With a secure job, decent credit score, and money in reserves, it has never been a better time to consider buying with today's low-interest rate environment.
