Enjoying all the amenities and residents of the community for years, Michael has a desire to give back to make the neighborhood the best it can be.



OC REAL ESTATE SELLING YOUR HOME 101 Buyer's Closing Costs

We've discussed curb appeal in a previous article; however, the



entryway is the first thing the potential buyer comes in to close contact with. If you have a front porch or portico and as the buyer walks up to the front door and awaits the Realtor to get the key and open it, what do you think they do? They look up at the ceiling. Many of these are made of drywall material just like that used on the inside of the house. The outside moisture environment can be very harsh on this material. If they see flaking or cracking, they will immediately believe the seller is not taking care of the home. Needless to say, that sets a precedent for the remainder of their viewing. So, stay on top of this and make repairs as needed to assure that these items are like new. If you have a carport, you need to stay on top of that as well.

As the door is a statement piece, be sure it is freshly painted or stained and in good working order. Also, look around for cobwebs and mud dauber nests and be sure they are removed. If you normally leave your front porch light on at night you may want to rethink that during the time you have your house on the market since it is a significant event that keeping these pests around. Lastly, make sure the stoop is clean and stain free from watermarks, etc.

ON THE LAKE Heelside Wake Jump

This will be a monthly article with steps to improve your wakeboarding, boat driving and other tips. This month we start with the building block of riding: the heelside wake jump. This will lay the foundation for future tricks and flips.

1. Body Position:

Standing tall with your back flat and a slight knee bend.

Keep the handle close to your hips. Keeping this body position helps leverage the rope and build line tension needed for pop off the wake.



2. Progressive Edge:

Learning how to edge progressively is one of the most important skills in wakeboarding. Majority of tricks require a progressive edge. There are other tricks that use a different edging.

Many riders make the mistake of a "turn and burn" edge into the wake. They make a quick turn into the wake and edge as hard as they can (like slalom skiing), then let off their edge when close to the wake. This is the opposite of a progressive edge. Start 10 - 15 feet outside the wake, then slowly roll your board onto its edge and build speed by leaning harder against the rope and pushing your heels into the water. The focus is not on how fast you are going, but to be at your fastest speed when you edge up the wake. Continue your cut up the wake.



3. Standing Tall:

At the wake, straighten your legs and stand tall. Edge through the wake, keep the handle in tight and standing tall are the keys. The takeoff is like jumping on a trampoline. When you land on the trampoline, you straighten your legs and keep your body firm. The trampoline then pushes you up into the air. Do not let your knees bend and absorb the pop. Once in the air, look forward to your landing and begin to bend your knees to soften the landing.
