Progress Continues on the New Carrollwood Fire Station #19

Construction crews continue working on building the new Hillsborough County Fire Station #19 at 13201 North Dale Mabry Highway. The fire station complex, which will include two bays and measure 6,650 square feet, replaces a smaller fire station that stood at the site from 1977 until last year. In the months since the demolition of the old fire station, the crew at Station 19 has been working out of a temporary structure that houses the fire and rescue teams as well as their equipment.

"Anytime we're remodeling or have a vacant property that we want to establish a fire and rescue team on, we'll build a temporary facility like you've seen [at Station 19] on Dale Mabry," says Frank Fernandez, Deputy Chief of Operations at Hillsborough County Fire Rescue. He doesn't



expect his crew to be working out of the temporary digs much longer. "We are about 70 percent complete," he remarks on the construction of the new concrete-block structure that stands behind the temporary fire station. "Once we're ready to move the fire rescue personnel into the new building, we will finish work on the exterior of the new facility." He adds that the station recently acquired a new rescue vehicle, which is now in use.

Chief Fernandez says Carrollwood's Station 19 handled 3,056 fire calls and 2,527 rescues in 2015, which represents a typical year for a Hillsborough County fire

It has probably been a decade (or more) since this has been done, so it is long overdue.



station. The new Carrollwood station will accommodate a fire truck and a rescue unit, which was the same configuration of the old Station 19. However, the crew space in the new station is much larger than at the former facility.

While there presently aren't more units being located at the expanded Station 19, Chief Fernandez assures there is plenty of backup coverage for the area served by Carrollwood's original fire station. "Station 19 also has backup from Station 43 near Ehrlich Road, Station 10 on Dale Mabry (near Waters Avenue), and Station 6 on Linebaugh Avenue."

Fernandez expects the new Carrollwood Station 19 to be complete by the summer.
"Currently," he remarks,
"that construction schedule remains on track."


2015 OC DOG PARK CHRISTMAS PARTY

As the humans chatted with one another about their pets and holiday plans, the dogs enjoyed each other's company and ran around doing what dogs do. A great time was had by all.



















which offer a good rate for a small fee. Internationally, Visa and MasterCard are the most widely accepted - be sure to let them know you'll be charging that llama ride in Machu Picchu.

3. Is Airbnb reliable?

As a travel professional, I can't send my clients into a stranger's home where we don't know what to expect. Renting a flat in Amsterdam isn't as sexy as it sounds, especially if the digs don't match the web photos. Who do I call for extra towels? If you like service and trusted advice, a hotel concierge can assist with reservations, local calls, etc.

4. Can I travel now to Cuba?

The US Government has granted tour operators a license to provide "people-to-people" educational exchange travel to Cuba on a limited basis. A visa is required and will be arranged by the tour company along with the flights, hotels, transfers and sightseeing. No individual travel is permitted yet, but thanks to resumed diplomatic relations, direct flights will soon become a reality. Currently, cruises are very expensive because there's limited competition and hefty government fees. Landlubbers and Seadogs Alike are Getting Excited for the 2016 Pirate Dance








3AB = 420 thus AB = 140

Check:

If AB = 140, then BC = 130 and CD = 120

ABCD = AB + BC + CD = 140 + 130 + 120 = 390


