





So, what can we make of all of these numbers? Let's begin by saying that the median values are probably the best to gauge the numbers. All of us, me included, believe everything we own is worth the top dollar. As an example, when the car dealer shows you the "blue book" price, you invariably think the highest price is what your car is worth. The reality is, it's not, Homes are much the same. We do upgrades in our homes and 10 years later we believe our home has been upgraded so it should be at the top of the range. WRONG! Most of our homes will be in that median range, and if the home has not had upgrades, it will fall in the lower square foot range. Another BIG factor is whether there is a pool or not. Carrollwood, for the most part, is pool desirable. What I mean by that is most of our homebuyers are young, family oriented people who seek that amenity for their family.

CAUTION: You see that number under "Days on the Market" that says "Max Value 339?" That stems from overpricing. I've said this before, and I'll say it again, if you overprice your home with the idea that you'll wait for someone to make you an offer, you are risking selling your home for less than it's real value. When a home is on the market for an excess amount of time, any time over 60 days, and in Carrollwood, the chances are you're overpriced and it gets what I call "the disease" which normally results in a lower than fair market value price.

Enjoy the data! By the way, if you missed the fireworks on New Years Eve at the beach, you missed a really good show. Thanks CCA, CRD. Just another one of those fabulous amenities you get by living in our great Community.


