Use of Sterile Grass Carp to Control Aquatic Weeds

Aquatic weeds are a serious problem for pond owners throughout Florida. They restrict access, reduce fish harvest and decrease the usefulness, attractiveness and value of Lake Carroll. Herbicides, mechanical removal, water level changes, dyes, fertilization and biological methods successfully control unwanted aquatic weed growth. Most folks are familiar with the traditional methods of aquatic weed control, but not with the recently available option of biological control by using sterile triploid grass carp (Figure 1).

The grass carp *(Cteno pharyngodon idella)* occurs naturally in large rivers of the eastern USSR and China. It was introduced into the United States in 1963 by the

United States Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife in cooperation with Auburn University. The feeding habits of the grass carp were well known and it was thought to have great potential as a biological weed control agent. However, there was concern that the grass carp could reproduce in the wild and become an environmental nuisance, destroying valuable areas such as wetlands, swamps and waterfowl feeding grounds.

Because of these environmental concerns, early research focused on developing sterile populations. Attempts included producing single-gender populations, creating sterile hybrids and removing gonads. Success was limited because these methods were seldom 100 percent effective and verification of sterility was difficult. In the early 1980s researchers and commercial producers began treating eggs with heat, cold or pressure to inhibit the second maturation division in the fertilized egg. This produced fish with abnormal chromosome numbers. The normal diploid grass carp has a chromosome number (2N) of 48, while the triploid grass carp has a chromosome number (3N) of 72. The extra chromosomes result in sterility.

We are very fortunate to have someone step up that cares deeply about our neighborhood. Please extend your thanks to John anytime you see him working around our parks.

Resident Eagle Scout candidate, Eric Kramer, presented plans to the Board for installation of exercise stations at Original Carrollwood Park as his Eagle project. The Board was very receptive of his plans. He will be working directly with Trustees Suzy Giunta and Paul Siddall to finalize a plan for installation. Any interested residents are encouraged to contact Paul or Suzy directly if you have ideas for this proposed project. Contact information for both of them appears in this publication.

Many of you may be aware that the nine seats on CRD Board of Trustees are elected positions. Elections for these seats for the 2015-2016 term will be held in November of this year, and will appear on the same ballot you see for Congress, the State Legislature, and for President every four years. But what has been forgotten in our neighborhood for many years is how to qualify for these elections and get on the ballot in November. There are two opportunities to qualify for the November elections. The first deadline is in May of this year, and the second is in June. If nine or less residents go through the qualifying process, all that qualify will be automatically elected and the race will not appear on the ballot in November. If 10 or more residents qualify, then there will be a contested election on the November ballot. In my April and May reports, I plan to give details on how you can qualify for the ballot. The last contested election (I believe) was in either 1994 or 1996.

If nine or less residents qualify for the elections, then the law calls for an appointment process in December of this year for the upcoming two-year term. In the past 10 or so years, only a few Trustees have been elected via the qualifying process, the remaining have served via the appointment process. We encourage all interested residents to learn about the qualifying process and consider offering your services to your neighborhood for the 2013-2014 term.

We are pleased to hear that the Civic Association is planning a new event on March 22nd, the Spring Fling, to be held at Original Carrollwood Park. Check CCA reports in this *Caroler* for details. I hope you can all join us at this exciting new event, and I wish to thank CCA Board Members in advance for their efforts in pulling it together.

In our February meeting, our focus was on erosion remediation efforts at White Sands Beach, and maintenance issues at Original Carrollwood Park. Trustee, Kevin Shidler, is still investigating options for installation of some sort of structure on the swim side of the beach, but it appears the engineering issues are not simple. Exactly what type of structure will give us the most benefits is still not clear. At OCP, the fences are in disrepair due to trespassers cutting through the park between Orange Grove Drive and Dale Mabry Highway. Fence repairs and landscaping work to reduce trespasser cut-throughs are being considered. Residents with suggestions for improvements to this park should attend future meetings. The public comment part of our meetings is always scheduled at the start of the meeting, so you can present your ideas and still get home at a reasonable hour.

I hope you are all enjoying the beautiful Spring weather, since here in Florida, winter only seems to last about a week. And I for one am glad our Florida spring has arrived.

Crime Watch receives too many reports to even forward. When your bike is stolen, then recovered by the Hillsborough County Sherriff's office, it's difficult to return.


Help is on the way.

The fear of the inspection is often every seller's nightmare. The roof is a significant part because insurance companies often require



wind mitigation. This normally adds about \$85 to the cost of the inspection. This cost is typically borne by the buyer. However, this inspection plays heavily on the cost of insurance as well as the willingness of a mortgage company to finance your home to a new buyer. In fact, we have seen instances where FHA has required the seller to replace the roof prior to closing when roofs are close to 15 years old. Once again, even though you may be selling your home "As-Is", the buyer cannot get a mortgage unless he can get insurance so unless the seller is willing to replace the roof at the seller's expense the sale will probably fall through. Ultimately, the seller will have to solve the problem if he wants to sell the home.

Roof strap tie-downs to the main structure (often referred to as clips, single wraps, or double wraps) are significant. The best time to have these installed is when replacing your roofing. Consulting with your insurance company about the positive impact this modification will have on the cost of your insurance can be significant. Also, considered as important to the installation of a new roof is the secondary water resistance (SWR). This is designed to protect the home from water intrusion in the event that there is roof covering loss.

So, if you need a new roof, call your insurance agent first to make sure you are getting what you need in order to reduce your cost as well as protect your home.



In Memory of Alex Boresoff

On January 30th, 2014, Alex Boresoff passed away. He was 42 years old.

The first time I met Alex, was over nine years ago in an interview for the maintenance position for our community. Hiring someone for this important job was one of my responsibilities at that time. There were over fifty applicants for the position and about twenty were interviewed.

When Becky Hanley and I selected Alex for the position, we both knew in a short time that we made the right decision for the community. When you interview an individual, like Alex, and you see a determination in his eyes, a sense of sincerity of heart, honesty in his talk, a strong desire to do his best, and a sense of humor, you know you have a good person.

Teaching Alex his job functions was a piece of cake. Tell him once and he would do the task before him. Show him once it would be done. Ask him to do something and he'd do it even better than expected. Alex will always be with me. His laughter was contagious and there were many times when we both shared that laughter. Alex had the ability to laugh at himself which is always a good trait in a person.

We all have seen Alex in and around the community. He was at the beach, at the parks and at the recreation center cleaning, fixing and doing what had to be done. He was an integral part of the engine that kept the community vibrant. His personality was congenial and there wasn't anyone he would refuse to help.

There are so many moments I can share about Alex but one comes to mind the most. It was during the 50th Anniversary of Original Carrollwood. Alex didn't live in our community, but he wanted the event to go off perfectly. This was his nature. That Friday, Alex came in earlier than usual, to not only assist me, but anyone who needed help. From Friday to Sunday night, Alex worked tirelessly. What was asked of him, he did, and at times came up with even better ways to attack the situation.

"You and electricity don't mix!" he told me. He was right! I hadn't a clue about electricity other than flipping a switch on or off. However, Alex knew what to do with plugging in and setting up some of the speakers and lighting etc.

Of course, his job wasn't done that weekend. He put up tents, collected the trash, cleaned the area (along with his sister Gio), and did so many other things that others would have balked at. This was the type of person he was.

On January 30th, 2014, Original Carrollwood not only lost a grounds man, a handyman, a maintenance man, we lost a friend.

Use of Sterile Grass Carp to Control Aquatic Weeds

Unfortunately, not all treated eggs develop into fish with abnormal chromosome numbers. A technique using an electronic particle size analyzer was developed in the early 1980s which identifies carp as triploids or diploids. Georgia laws and regulations require each grass carp be verified and documented as a triploid.

Feeding Habits

Triploid and diploid grass carp appear to consume similar quantities of aquatic plants and to have similar feeding habits, preferring succulent young plants. Table 1 lists some common aquatic plants and rates them by grass carp feeding preferences. Grass carp will not control all types of aquatic weeds. Because of selective feeding habits, they can eliminate one plant species and make room for the expansion of others.

Stocking

If the grass carp is the preferred weed control option, stocking proper numbers is important. Stocking rates of five to over 200 fish per acre have been used depending on plant species, plant density and distribution, the size and age of the fish and the pond owner's objectives. There are computer models that determine the appropriate stocking density by considering additional factors such as the amount of human activity around the pond, the desired level of control and grass carp feeding preferences. The numbers recommended are designed to provide a 75 to 90 percent reduction in target plant species in three to four years. In most situations, complete removal of aquatic vegetation is undesirable because the vegetation provides cover for small fishes and attachment surfaces for fish food organisms.

Grass carp stocking densities are based on the maximum expected weed coverage and the feeding preference rating of the weeds. We will be stocking Lake Carroll with 576 carp.
