The CRD Board is pleased to announce that after an almost year long process, a new ground maintenance contract is in place for the neighborhood. The base annual contract is \$60,000, and the amount of time Board Member Bill Lais committed to the bid process cannot be overstated. Bill is a professional engineer, so his expertise in this matter has been invaluable. Bill completely rewrote the scope of work, which is a very comprehensive

11-page document outlining the work to be performed in very specific detail. T h e Board selected Greenview Landscaping, Inc., which has been in business for 32 years. Greenview was the lowest bid, specializing in homeowner's associations and community development districts in Hillsborough, Pasco, and Pinellas Counties.

Also, the Board voted at the February meeting to no longer allow inflatables and bounce houses at any of the neighborhood properties. After a comprehensive review process, it was determined that inflatables and bounce houses were too much of a liability exposure.

Proper Dog Park [DP] Protocol

To help insure the safety, enhance the enjoyment, and promote the general well-being of all - both dogs and dog owners - here are a few suggested/recommended tips/ procedures.

1. Don't forget your key to the DP!

2. Remember to securely close behind you each gate you go through (there are some double gates).

3. Always clean up after your dog: be alert to where/ when your dog poops, and come armed with poop bags for cleanup. (There are some provided at the DP, but for big dogs larger bags are better: Publix plastic bags or plastic newspaper bags are good.) 4. Dog leashes should be used in the Main Park, but inside the DP they are not conducive to dog safety: they can sometimes invite entanglement, plus contrary behavior by other dogs.



5. Bringing small children inside the DP should be done warily: big dogs, even though friendly, can sometimes be too rambunctious for the little ones. It should also be noted that holding small children in one's arms will often cause dogs' curiosity to kick in and result in their jumping.

6. Giving your dog a treat inside the DP is not forbidden, but should be done with caution and, in so far as feasible, apart from other dogs (who naturally want to be included), who might otherwise behave in an anomalous manner.

PROPER DP PROTOCOL

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OC REAL ESTATE SELLING YOUR HOME 101

FLIPPERS

The term 'Flipper' may be familiar to some of you and not so familiar to others. There is a growing group



of people out there who are buying distressed or non-upgraded homes and then renovating them and selling them for a profit. That can be good for the buyer or bad for the buyer, depending upon who the flipper is.

How do you determine if you're dealing with a flipper? Go into public records and see when the last purchase was made. You can also determine how much they paid for the property in most cases. Also, this will let you know if the work was permitted. In most cases, the OWNER of the property can do work on the property without getting a permit. Without a permit, you have know idea whether or not the repairs meet codes. These people, more often than not, are NOT licensed contractors. They are typical handyman types who have a flair for knowing what buttons push a buyer into buying. Some will do a very professional job while others will do what I call "once-over lightly" work. So the buyer has to be savvy about what to look for.

Check out the flooring. If there is carpet, look closely at the root of the material into the base and see how far apart the weave is. Good quality will have tight weave. Look at wood flooring. Is it really wood or pergo or laminate or engineered wood? Can it be sanded?

Kitchens and bathrooms are also biggies. Cabinetry may not be fastened or mounted properly and it may be an inferior product. Everyone wants granite, but is the granite too thin for an overhang of the cabinet? People sitting up to a counter will rest arms on it. If this product is too thin, it WILL break. Are there any cracks in the granite that have been covered up with epoxy?

No matter what, be sure you get a qualified, licensed and certified inspector to come in and go through the home with a fine-tooth comb. It's the best \$300-\$500 you'll spend. Your professional Realtor can help you with this. Be sure you have a seller's disclosure that is complete. The sellers may want to generate "Seller's Disclosure for Non-Occupancy" form. However, if they have renovated this house, there is no reason that they shouldn't be able to generate a standard disclosure, and I would recommend that you demand such paperwork.

Many cruisers, especially those who carry a FL driver's license, have sailed the Caribbean multiple times with 2,000+ shipmates and breathed the cool, evergreen breezes in Alaska to escape the Tampa summer. We've snapped pix of Big Ben, the Eiffel Tower and the Coliseum. And, voila! 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Home Solicitation Sales - Who's Knocking On Your Door?

I want to thank Hillsborough County Commissioner Victor Crist and his staff for sending us the following information. If you have ever wondered the rules and proper identification required as it relates to door-todoor Home Solicitation Sales please read on. This article also provides an example of what the proper "permit" should look like. I recommend that you cut this out of *The Caroler* for reference the next time someone comes knocking on your door.

Home solicitations in Hillsborough County account for a large number of consumer complaints each year. A home solicitation is any sale, lease or rental of a consumer good or service with a purchase price that exceeds \$25, including all interest, service charges, finance charges, postage, freight, insurance, and handling charges, and the sale is consummated in a place other than at the seller's fixed establishment or business location.

If a home solicitor knocks on the door and cannot show a County-issued permit, ask them to leave or call your local law enforcement agency.

What Consumers Should Know About Home Solicitations

• It is unlawful for any person to conduct a home solicitation sale in the state of Florida without a valid home solicitation sale permit issued by the Clerk of the Circuit Court.

• Home solicitors are required to carry and display their permit and certificate.

• This permit is very important because it requires the salesman to file a sworn application providing all of their personal information, a photograph, and a complete set of fingerprints.

• The Clerk forwards this information to the Sheriff and Florida Department of Law Enforcement for criminal background checks.

• Consumers should "verify before they buy." Ask the solicitor to see the permit.

• Consumers can verify the home solicitor has a permit by contacting the Clerk of the Circuit Court.

• In Hillsborough County, consumers can call the Clerk's recording office at 813-276-8100 Ext. 4157.

• All home solicitation sales must have a written sales agreement and 3-day cancellation provision.

• This sales agreement must contain the date of the transaction, the buyer's signature, and the BUYERS RIGHT TO CANCEL.

Any home solicitor who violates the terms and conditions of Florida's home solicitation law can face criminal charges punishable as a first-degree misdemeanor, with a second conviction resulting in a third-degree felony.


October is Going to be **PINKALICIOUS!**
