## Celebrating All Types of Love

With Valentine's Day nestled in the center of last month, much of February was dedicated to love. However, although the focus is often solely placed on romantic love, it is essential to recall that there are multiple types of love classified by the Greeks—each of which holds great importance and deserves to be celebrated not just in February, but throughout the whole year.

Believing love to be innately complex and practically indescribable, the ancient Greeks created six different terms to describe six distinct types of love: Eros, passionate love; philia, the love of friendship; ludus, playful love; agape, love for

everyone; pragma, longstanding love; and philautia, love of self.

The Greeks regarded each kind of love with the highest importance; thus, they deemed it impossible to arrange them into a hierarchy and instead believed all six were equal. Therefore, if February is considered the “month of love,” it is fitting that types of loves beyond those which are considered romantic in nature—eros, ludus, and pragma—should also be celebrated and appreciated.

Philia, the love of friendship, was highly valued by the Greeks. Because deep friendship is a love built on the foundation of two people continually choosing to ensure the other's wellbeing through constant support and loyalty, it creates a firm and nearly unbreakable bond. The true comradeship created through making sacrifices for one another and sharing experiences, while asking for no gratification in return, is impossible to replicate. Throughout the year, we should make it a priority to not only treasure and show appreciation for our significant others, but also our faithful friends.

Agape, often regarded as “selfless love,” calls for the love of all people and is considered by some to be the most radical of the six. The idea of agape, translated as “charity” in Latin, appears in many religious traditions including both Christianity and Buddhism. Agape relies heavily upon empathy and equality,

## OCP Softball Project

Original Carrollwood Park has a new lighted, regulation size softball field!

This project started in October when Trustee Carelli was approached by a number of girls travel softball teams about renting our field. At the time the field was set up with a grass infield for baseball and did not have any lights for evening practices. I was not sure if it would work, so, I posed the question to the Board at the next meeting. The overwhelming response was that the field was rarely used in its current state and if it were

economically viable, we would be open to renovating the field and renting it to one or two teams.

So, I put together bids, planned the project out and gauged interest from the coaches who wanted to rent the field. I presented my findings at the next Board meeting and obtained approval to move forward with the project. Construction started in earnest during December. Many of you have likely driven by and seen the project unfold.

First, the grass infield had to be excavated, and trenches had to be dug to run the electric service. Then, the new clay had to be delivered, put down, tilled, and leveled. When this was complete, the electric poles were set, and the lights were installed. After some late night adjusting, the field has sufficient lighting without installing outfield poles.

Next, the two coaches and I spent a Saturday at the field installing a home plate, pitchers rubber, and the three bases to regulation softball specs. The bases are all cemented in and are of park quality for long lasting use. A shipping container was also placed at the far side of the field to house the golf cart. The cart will be used to drag and maintain the field.

Lastly, signed rental agreements for the next two years were finalized for two girl teams: Ages 10 and under, The Lady Gators; and ages 12 and under, The Florida Octane. We welcome and encourage the residents to use and enjoy the field and the lights at any time that these teams are not practicing. We hope our residents utilize this facility more than in the past and that we introduce new people to our wonderful neighborhood that is Original Carrollwood. 🇺🇸

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# Tax Time Tips

Filing your income taxes is synonymous with April, but March is also crunch time to focus on paying Uncle Sam. Often important financial documents like K-1's are just coming in the mail, or worse, financial institutions send you 'corrected' statements to replace the ones they previously sent.

Here are 3 ways you can get a handle on tax time::

## 1. Still time to save for retirement

While most deadlines occurred on December 31, 2016, there is still time to make a contribution to some retirement accounts. IRAs (Traditional, Roth, SEP) and Keogh plans (Individual 401k) will accept contributions up to April 17, 2017. All contributions aside from Roth IRA contributions can provide a deduction. As an example, if you are in the 25% tax bracket and you save \$5,500 (the max amount for individuals under 50) in an IRA account, you can save \$1,375 in taxes.

## 2. Get organized now

Filing your taxes is easiest when you are organized. Print out a copy of last year's return to use as a guide. It should get you started with what you will need



for 2017 and what statements you should be on the look out for. Scan your mail and emails for the various "Important Tax Document" items that recap the information you need. The more organized you are the better. Don't be the person who still drops off statements and receipts in a shoe box to your accountant.

## 3. Prepared taxes vs. Proactive taxes

Most people have their taxes prepared. Understand that this is just recapping what happened last year. If you want to address or impact the taxes you pay for 2017, you have to become proactive throughout the current year. Find an accountant or CPA who will provide you with feedback or a tax plan as early as mid-year. This information could lead to actionable steps to help you reduce the amount of taxes you pay.

Few people get excited about filing taxes. But you can take the sting out of tax time by getting organized and being proactive.

Many of you have probably considered the idea of owning one or more income properties to increase your wealth. With interest rates so low, and money market returns low as well, this option is not too far fetched. But wait a minute. Do you know what you're getting into?

There are some very real advantages. For instance, you get a direct income stream. Money comes directly to you monthly and therefore goes into paying the mortgage, or if there is no mortgage, it will go directly to your business account. If you finance even as an investment, interest rates have been very good and with a 20% investment can conceivably yield a

very positive return. If property values increase, you stand to make even greater gains should you decide to sell. On top of that, there are significant tax advantages through current deduction and depreciation allowances. You would have the benefit of writing off interest on the mortgage, insurance, any maintenance cost, expenses for driving to and from the property, legal or professional fees, and property taxes.

But, there are disadvantages that must be considered as well. If you buy outright, there is the possibility that you will have a significant outlay of your personal wealth in one item. If any tragic event occurs to that property such as the 2008 meltdown you could take a hard hit. Then there are the issues with the tenants. Screening is time-consuming and expensive and, unless you know the person, your property becomes vulnerable to unexpected damage as well as tenants not meeting due dates on payments and skipping out on you without payment. Usually, after the tenant leaves, you have to repaint and often replace carpet and flooring. Also, while there are tax advantages, there are also tax disadvantages. You have to pay them! You have to pay insurance and HOA fees, if applicable, as well.

But possibly the worst problem is being called at 11 p.m. to fix the toilet because it's running over and the tenant doesn't know how to stop it. Remember that nothing happens at a convenient time. You must be involved. The roof will occasionally need replacing, and the driveway might need resurfacing. Appliances age and when they do they become costly.

So have I scared you off? Hopefully not. My objective here is to make sure you think the process through. This

type of investment is not for everyone, but there are many of you out there in Carrollwood who have done this with great success. As for me... I'll just stick to helping people buy and sell their property.


## SOLUTION TO LAST MONTH'S PUZZLE
