



OC REAL ESTATE SELLING YOUR HOME 101

LOW INVENTORY

Currently, the Tampa Bay Area inventory of homes for sale is very low. Statewide, we are reflecting about a 3%



inventory of available homes for sale. The norm for a Buyer/Seller market is 4%. For those of you following my articles, you have probably recognized that we are much further below the 4% mark. In fact, since I began this column in *The Caroler* a little over two years ago, we have consistently been between ½% and 1%.

The immediate reaction is: "WOW! I can really jack up the price of my home now." WRONG! Yes, it's true that our homes sell for more per square foot in North Tampa than other subdivisions, but there are other factors involved. Most important is the appraisal. For example, let's say you have a buyer willing to pay you \$300,000 for your home and you have a contract pending for that sum. Then the appraiser comes along for the buyer's lending institution and he says the house is only worth \$280K. If the mortgage is being developed on the basis of an 80% loan to buyer, the lending institution is only going to loan the buyer \$224K (80% of \$280K). So now the buyer has to come up with \$76K down payment rather than the \$60K they had planned. So what happens next? The seller either comes down on their price to meet the appraisal or the buyer typically walks. Because this is a contingency in 99.9% of all contracts, you will not be able to keep the escrow deposit. In the process, you have lost valuable time in selling your home.

With the new Dodd-Frank law taking effect in January, Appraisers are put into a pool and mortgage companies just draw from that pool. Therefore appraisers are coming to Carrollwood from Sarasota, New Port Richey and many other places. They don't always know that Carrollwood is different from Forest Hills or Northdale and the end result is a problem. Realtors are not allowed to intimidate appraisers in anyway. We can, however, give them a package reflecting how we arrived at our pricing decision. I have a full package of amenities, along with a comparative analysis, used for determining price that I give to the appraisers which enables them to have the ability to sort out why Carrollwood prices are higher than our neighboring communities. That's the only way we are able to keep our prices where they should be.

In essence, pricing your home is a lot more than coming up with a number that YOU think it's worth. And most of all that price is NEVER based on what you need.

Italy. Along the spectacular Italian Riviera, there is a string of five villages--the Cinque Terre--that has captured the hearts of travelers since the days of Dante, including OC residents, Steve and Debbie Gitomer.



Cinque Terre

The towns are strung along a 10-mile stretch of rugged coastline, and none is more than a two-hour walk from the other. A train service links them, but jump in your Sketchers to really enjoy some of the most awe-inspiring vistas nature has bestowed on Europe. Each trail begins with a long climb up dozens of steep stone steps; a hiking holiday here will test your knees. To one side are azure blue waters where on a clear day it's possible to see Corsica. Inland are medieval streets and terraced vineyards still farmed by traditional means.

Along the route, bell towers provide a musical backdrop

to the wondrous views of the Ligurian Sea. The year-round temperate climate is ideal, but I suggest you avoid the summer when the crowds swarm the beaches. Non-hikers can enjoy the view from a ferry that departs from La Spezia where you might descend for a seafood lunch in Vernazza, then reboard for an afternoon espresso at Monterosso, a lively shopping stop before returning to La Spezia, halfway between Pisa and Genoa.

This is one of the most romantic hiking regions in the world. Lovers' graffiti is inscribed in rock faces along the route where fences are lined with padlocks (think Paris *bridges*) by couples in testimony to their everlasting love. The keys are thrown into the sea.

Nepal. The trek to Everest base camp is the holy grail for hikers/mountain climbers. Following in the footsteps of Hillary (the other one), experiencing life at the camp and immersing yourself in Sherpa country and culture, you'll see the treacherous ice cliffs of the Khumbu Icefall that leads to the South Col and witness for yourself the iconic view of Everest from the summit of Kala Patthar.

It's obviously a long trip-plan on 3-4 weeks including stopovers. United Airlines can take you from Tampa to Newark to Mumbai with an overnight at the airport. Grand Hvatt is a wonderful hotel where foodies will love the buffet on the lower level; the selection of international cuisines is world-class. From Mumbai, fly to Kathmandu on Jet Airways, then spend a couple of nights in Kat before flying to Lukla to begin the trek.







You'll need to be at least a moderate hiker in order to cover 5-8 miles a day. The altitude will wear you down and possibly make you sick; hence, the slow trip up the valley from Lukla at 9000' to Lobuche at 16,000' and Everest Base Camp

at 17,500.' Living in Tampa, it's difficult to prepare for the altitude even if you are in great shape. Drink plenty of bottled water. 🕥
