ue to the current state of emergency and the statewide safer-at-home order, the CRD Board conducted its April meeting via communications media technology. I would like to recognize and thank the following residents for calling into the meeting & participating: Dr. Anna Brown, Sheila Santafemia and son Eli, David Williams, Andrea & Jack Griffie, Lucas Howes, Shelley Stewart, and Janet Bourland - (all mentioned here are non-board members).

The CRD Board has relied on the advice from our general counsel regarding park closures. Some residents have asked why we have to follow the County and State guidelines when our Community is private. The reality is that the CRD Board is a State Agency and manages and operates all the Community properties with tax dollars. So in short, this is the reason. When we see the County reopen it's neighborhood parks, we will to do the same.

The boat ramp has remained open because the County and City have kept some of their boat ramps open. We have posted

a sign at White Sands Beach about boat launching procedures, and given the guard

service discretion to accommodate residents. The main thing is that boats have to be launched and taken out while
the guard is present, because
the guard locks up when he goes
home. The earliest time a boat
can be launched is 11:30 a.m.,
as this is when the guard arrives.
The procedures posted indicate the
latest launch is at 4 p.m.; however,

there is some flexibility there if you speak with the guard.

Currently, the business office inside the Recreation Center is closed, so there has been no issuance of keys to any of the parks or boat ramp. The office staff does check the telephone messages and emails and respond, but is not seeing residents in-person at this time.

Lastly, you will notice the Lake Carroll Way median landscape project is complete. We do have some areas that need some touch up with new sod, but the Board decided at the April meeting to hold off on that for the moment.

We look forward to getting everything back up and running as soon as we can.





## Pan Roasted Corn with Basil

## Ingrediento

- corn, fresh, frozen or canned
- olive oil
- salt
- pepper
- parmesan cheese
- basil

## Instructions

Drain, rinse, drain and add thawed (if using frozen) corn to a hot skillet. Cast iron works best but any skillet will do. Wipe/season pan with olive oil only enough to coat it, sprinkle with salt (optional) and pepper. Cook on high heat until the corn browns. Watch carefully, this step is quick. The amount of browning determines how strong the smokey flavor will be. Add Parmesan cheese and basil to taste.
