The CRD's general counsel (GC) was on the call and updated everyone on the park closings during this unique time and when we might expect to reopen. The GC's recommendation was to follow Hillsborough County because they have public health experts, whereas



the CRD does not, and to be out-of-line with the County could risk the CRD's special taxing authority. Also, White Sands Beach is considered a neighborhood park, so when Hillsborough County reopens their neighborhood parks with playground equipment and picnic tables, we should be able to do the same.

Lastly, a great big thanks to CCA Board members Jim Powell & Bryan Huls for calling in to the meeting. They both were able to take the GC's advice and guidance and share it at their Board meeting.

The Board of Trustees of the Carrollwood Recreation District, a Florida independent special district, will hold a public hearing on Monday, June 8, 2020, at 6:30 p.m. The purpose of the public hearing will be so property owners and residents within the district may appear and be heard before the adoption of the 2020-2021 budget. 

That's about 0.5% of all our houses. The national average for a community like ours is 4.0%. As I have said many times in the past, YOU are responsible for that. When you talk to your non-resident friends about how great our Community is, the word travels. When visitors drive through our area and see the care and maintenance that the majority of you put into your homes and yards, they notice.

I recently had a client come to me to take them around OC. They didn't even know where it was, but they had heard of it from friends. They didn't know of all the homeowner amenities, and they were aghast at the beauty of our recreation facilities and the vastness of our lake.

Keep up those external communications! Let people know about the correspondence that flows from the security representative of the CCA, and how little our safety issues are.

And oh, one other thing. I often hear OC people complaining about people walking or running in the streets. They don't understand why they don't do that on the sidewalks. Well. there's a simple explanation. Most people walk in pairs. During the development of OC, the sidewalks were not built very wide. If you drive around Carrollwood Village, which was initially started by the builders of OC, you will note that the sidewalks are considerably wider. Therefore, you'll see most people over there on the sidewalks. My suggestion to you is watch out when driving around our neighborhood and give those

people who want to be together some space. •


