



The Board is in the very early stages of researching the steps to follow for increasing the District's annual tax assessment. Just at the May meeting, we had twelve residents in attendance asking for major improvements that are big expenditures. We have averaged 6 to 12 residents attending the meetings for the last 18 months. We are managing the tax dollars like a rubber band, repairing things as they break. Ultimately, this would require a community vote (referendum) during a regularly scheduled election and the soonest that could occur is August 2022. If the Community approved it, the soonest we would begin receiving the additional dollars would be November of 2023 and into 2024. So as you can see, this is a very long process and no decision has been made yet.

Also, at the May meeting, Board member Mike Carelli invited a local locksmith for a access control presentation (using a fob). It created more questions and is complex and very expensive. No decision was made.

Work should begin soon at Scotty Cooper Park on new fencing and new entrance gate. The gate will be key access.

The Board of Trustees of the Carrollwood Recreation District, a Florida independent special district, will hold a public hearing on Monday, June 14, 2021, at 6:30 p.m. The purpose of the public hearing will be so property owners and residents within the district may appear and be heard before the adoption of the 2021-2022 budget. The meeting is open to the public and will be held at the Carrollwood Recreation Center located at 3515 McFarland Road, Tampa, Florida 33618. Persons with disabilities needing special accommodations to participate in this meeting should contact the District Office at 813-932-1257 at least 24 hours prior to the meeting. Per Chrissie, "the brick had to first be added before the pattern could be taken for the fabrication of the custom panel." So, the white banner is temporary.

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

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Boating safety, driving tips

As our lake has gotten busier over the last few years, it is time to renew our focus on boating safety and etiquette on Lake Carroll. Follow these basic safety tips and enjoy Lake Carroll with family and friends.

BOATING SAFETY:

For more information and boat safety courses visit: myfwc.com/boating/safety-education

In order to operate a motorboat of ten (10) horsepower or greater, Florida law requires anyone who was born on or after Jan. 1, 1988, to successfully complete an approved boating safety course and obtain a Boating Safety Education Identification Card issued by the FWC.

Use and maintain the right safety equipment.

Have a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket for each person on board and one approved throwable device for any boat 16 feet and longer.

LAKE CARROLL: BOATING & PERSONAL WATERCRAFTS (PWC, JET SKI, SEA-DOO)

White Sand Beach area and the canals are considered a “NO WAKE ZONE.” For safety of other boats and swimmers, enter and exit at a slow, safe speed.

Life jackets must be worn by all personal watercraft riders and skiers.

Always boat on Lake Carroll in a counterclockwise direction.


Check the boat traffic on the lake. If there are too many boats pulling skiers/tubes, then wait until a few skiers are done with their runs. The fewer boats operating with skiers on the lake, the safer it will be.



Mornings and evenings are typically times with fewer boats on the water.

Never allow passengers to ride on the bow area of a boat, gunwales or outside of protective railings/seats, including the front of a pontoon boat. A sudden turn, stop or start could cause a fall overboard.

The main rule we see broken is boaters & PWCs (jet skis) following other boats pulling skiers/tubes entirely too close. Never follow directly behind another watercraft. PLEASE GIVE SKIERS and TUBES SPACE.



and Etiquette

PULLING SKIERS (SKIING, WAKEBOARDING, SURFING, TUBING)

All skiers/wakeboarders/surfers should wear a Coast Guard approved life jacket.

Use a spotter and/or a large mirror and be aware of other boats in your area.

Keep your skier a safe distance from all docks, boats, structures, paddleboarders, kayakers, etc.

Avoid power turns: When a skier falls, make sure to come off the throttle and slowly turn/approach your skier. This is unsafe and throws wakes throughout the lake. The only time a power turn is recommended is if you are in a busy area with approaching boats or a skier could be injured.

BOATING ETIQUETTE TIPS

When wakesurfing or driving a larger boat that can create a large wake:

can create a large wake:

Stay at least 200 feet away from structures or shore; this allows your wake to dissipate before impacting




Diagram 1: Power turns send wakes out in all directions, even toward the rider.

the shore & docks.

Avoid close passes to other boats, paddleboards, kayaks and docks.



Keep music at a responsible level; sound travels much farther than you think on the water, and loud music can ruin other boaters' and homeowners' peace and quiet.

Finally, be aware of how your wake is affecting others. In addition to other boaters, docks and shoreside properties, this applies to other watersports enthusiasts too. When you pick up a downed rider, do not remain at surfing speed and make a big looping turn back toward the person in the water.

Please share these safety and driving tips with others on Lake Carroll, including boaters that are not in Original Carrollwood.

Follow these basic tips and everyone will enjoy their time on the water we share.

Share the water responsibly & watch your wake.

REAL ESTATE 101: MARKET SLOWDOWN ?????

What's with this crazy market? Especially here in Original Carrollwood. Unless the price that the seller is asking for is astronomically high, our homes are selling in days and sometimes just hours. Does it remind you a little of 2008? As I stated in an earlier article, things are much different than 2008. Of course the main factor is that interest rates continue to be low. How long will that last? No one knows, but it has certainly been affected by the COVID.

Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac have both predicted a softening of previous estimates. Most of this will be related to mortgage originations as interest rates slowly increase. Keep in mind that "mortgage originations" include the many refinancing loans that people have gotten to reduce their interest rates and thereby their monthly payments.

The higher prices are finally beginning to reach a point that prevents some potential buyers from getting into the market. Still the FHFA Home Price Index is predicting a rise in home sales for 2021 to be 8%, however, in 2022 that's anticipated to fall to 2.9%. The current increase is due in part to interest rates holding steady while the economy gradually gets back to normal.

So, as always, the question remains whether to buy or sell? Will the housing market begin to take a dive? My answer to that is the old stock market saying, "You can't time the market". You have to do what you believe is best for
