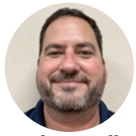

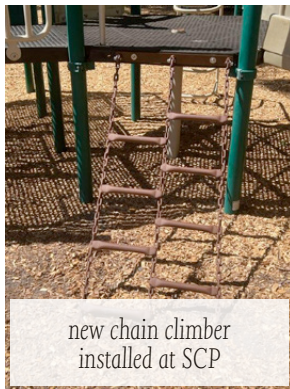



POWER LINES:

TECO is currently in Phase 1 - tree trimming (they went from an avg of \$6 million a year to \$22 million this year in tree trimming and removal).

They will be starting into Phase 2 - upgrading poles and replacing equipment on existing poles to help with storm resilience.

TECO is on a 3-5 year plan overall to strengthen the overall system. We are continuing to coordinate with TECO to get updates on their plans. We will send out information as it comes available.

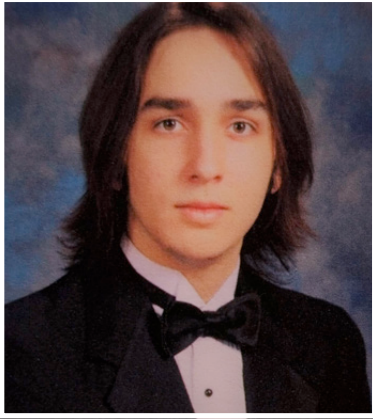

REAL ESTATE 101

Recently, a property in our area that I viewed was placed on the market for \$750K. The property was made available as the result of the death of the owner. The owner was an American citizen but her children were European citizens who were certain they knew how to price the home.

They used an on-line company to view recent sales of the same type home in the same area to determine what the house was worth but they added their own twist. The house had been purchased by their mother who had added \$250K worth of improvements. The children believed that this could easily be added to the average price they had come up with for current sales.

This house had been totally upgraded but the mother wanted it to reflect the same styling as her former European country. She found a company in south Tampa happy to do just that. One hundred and seventy thousand of those dollars went into a very spartan European styled kitchen that wouldn't have a great deal of appeal to most people who grew up in the states.

Their sale was dropped to \$675K a month later and finally sold for about \$605K. As it turned out the \$605K was less than the real value of the home based on comparables but they probably lost their best buyers who were the first to show up and then never pursued further assuming that the price would never meet their expectations. Unless they could get a cash buyer, there was probably no chance of anyone getting a satisfactory appraisal to get a loan.

In the real world, the mortgage companies do not care how much you put into your house for renovations. They only care about how much the home is truly worth on the market as judged by the appraiser.

When you plan to make upgrades to your home, don't do them based

on how much impact you think they'll make on your resale. Do them based on how much enjoyment you can get out of them for you and your family. How much you spend on your upgrades will not factor into your appraiser's final number. Improvements do factor into the appraiser's number but not how much you pay for them.

Do upgrades for yourself like this lady had done and then enjoy them. Your home is YOUR home for your enjoyment.

Boating Safety, Driving Tips and Etiquette

It is time, again, to renew our focus on boating safety and etiquette on Lake Carroll. Follow these basic safety tips and enjoy Lake Carroll with family and friends.

BOATING SAFETY:

For more information and boat safety courses visit: myfwc.com/boating/safety-education

In order to operate a motorboat of ten (10) horsepower or greater, Florida law requires anyone who was born on or after Jan. 1, 1988 to successfully complete an approved boating safety course and obtain a Boating Safety Education Identification Card issued by the FWC.

Use and maintain the right safety equipment.

Have a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket for each person on board and one approved throwable device for any boat 16 feet and longer.

LAKE CARROLL: BOATING & PERSONAL WATERCRAFTS (PWC, JET SKI, SEA-DOO)

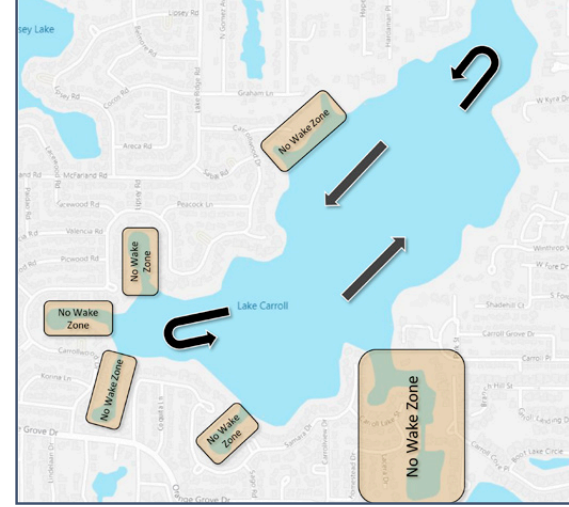
- White Sand Beach area and the canals are considered a "NO WAKE ZONE." For safety of other boats and swimmers, enter and exit at a slow, safe speed.
- Life jackets must be worn by all personal watercraft riders and skiers.
- Always boat on Lake Carroll in a counterclockwise direction.
- Check the boat traffic on the lake. If there are too many boats pulling skiers/tubes, then wait until a few skiers are done with their runs. The fewer boats operating with skiers on the lake, the safer it will be. Mornings and evenings are typically times with fewer boats on the water.
- Never allow passengers to ride on the bow area of a boat, gunwales or outside of protective railings/seats, including the front of a pontoon boat. A sudden turn, stop or start could cause a fall overboard.
- The main rule we see broken is boaters & PWCs (jet skis) following other boats pulling skiers/tubes entirely too close. Never follow directly behind another watercraft. PLEASE GIVE SKIERS and TUBES SPACE.

PULLING SKIERS (SKIING, WAKEBOARDING, SURFING, TUBING)

- All skiers/wakeboarders/surfers should wear a coast

guard approved life jacket.

- Use a spotter and/or a large mirror and be aware of other boats in your area.
- Keep your skier a safe distance from all docks, boats, structures, paddleboarders, kayakers, etc.
- Avoid Power Turns: When a skier falls, make sure to come off the throttle and slowly turn/approach your skier. This is unsafe and throws wakes throughout the lake. The only time a power turn is recommended is if you are in a busy area with approaching boats or a skier could be injured.



BOATING ETIQUETTE TIPS

When wakesurfing or driving a larger boat that can create a large wake:

- Stay at least 200 feet away from structures or shore; this allows your wake to dissipate before impacting the shore & docks.
- Avoid close passes to other boats, paddleboards, kayaks and docks.
- Keep music at a responsible level; sound travels much farther than you think on the water, and loud music can ruin other boaters' and homeowners' peace and quiet.
- Finally, be aware of how your wake is affecting others. In addition to other boaters, docks and shoreside properties, this applies to other watersports enthusiasts too. When you pick up a downed rider, do not remain at surfing speed and make a big looping turn back toward the person in the water.
- Please share these safety and driving tips with others on Lake Carroll, including boaters that are not in Original Carrollwood.

Follow these basic tips and everyone will enjoy their time on the water we share.

Share the water responsibly & watch your wake.

Collectively the community can make a positive impact on our water quality. Please be mindful of the items that end up in our lake.

Keep leaves, grass clippings and other yard materials out of the street/drains. Pickup after your pets before it washes to the lake.

Fertilize responsibly and look to use native plants.

Do not litter while on the lake and clean up fishing lines. Pickup any trash items that may have fallen into the lake.

Keep pollutants out of storm drains!

Pollution carried through stormwater runoff is one of the largest threats to urban water bodies. Nearly 900,000 acres of Florida lakes have been classified as impaired for recreation or aquatic life, mostly caused by urban/agricultural runoff. Currently, Original Carrollwood does not possess a comprehensive stormwater filtration system, so anything that finds its

way into the storm drains will flow into Lake Carroll in a matter of minutes. Excess nutrients, largely through fertilizer runoff, and high bacterial loads through stormwater runoff, can impair the lake.

Bacterial Contamination

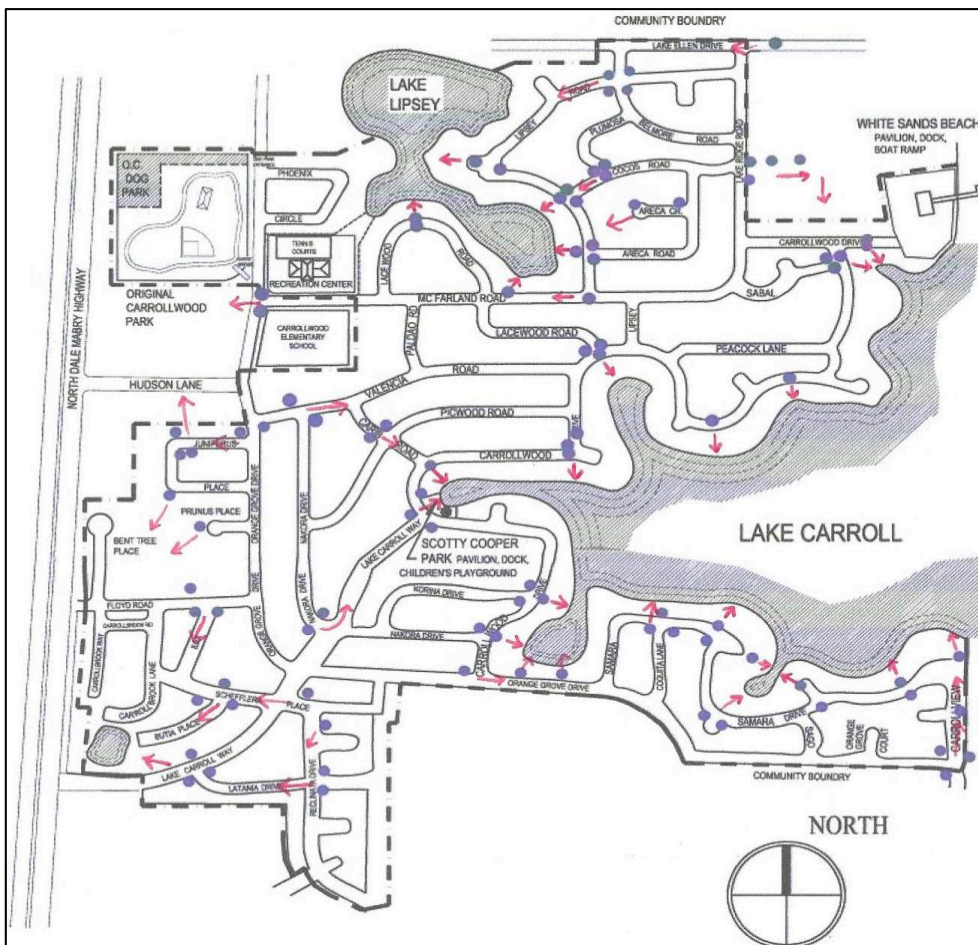
Bacteria are common in lake systems, but can become dangerous if certain types are present in large quantities. Lake Carroll is regularly tested by Hillsborough County to ensure safe levels of E. coli and other bacteria.

- **Main causes:** Damaged septic systems, leaking sanitary sewers, wildlife, pet waste in runoff.

- **Effect:** Restriction of recreation access until bacterial levels return to normal (closing of White Sands Beach).

How to prevent: Properly maintain septic systems and remove pet waste from yards.

Approximately 100 storm drains capture water from Original Carrollwood. If you see contaminants entering a drain, please fill out a report form through the Hillsborough County Water Atlas website. [CC](https://www.hillsboroughcounty.org/Portals/0/Assets/Forms/Report%20Problem%20Form.pdf)
