




Congratulations OC Graduates!

OC REAL ESTATE REAL ESTATE - 101 VENTING and OTHER SAFETY THOUGHTS

Do you have a fire pit lurking in your attic? Where is your clothes dryer

venting? Lots of building practices that took place during the time that our Original Carrollwood homes were built would not stand



up to code today. I would say that, generally, many construction practices were not considered to be detrimental and, thus, went on for long periods of time.

One of those was the practice of venting dryer airflow through the ceiling and into our attics. Recently, inspections in some of my pending homes in Original Carrollwood have revealed this practice. Lint is typically a highly flammable source and when these vents terminate inside the attic the lint piles up making for a risky situation.

You can easily check this out in your home and if your vent is not going outside of the house you need to get that fixed. The cost is usually nominal. But you have to make sure that the repairman THOROUGHLY cleans the attic area where the lint has settled.

Another item that could be very costly to you is the water heater. When our homes were built, builders were not concerned so much about the damage that a leaking water heater could cause. In my house, there was a slight lip down in the flooring where the water heater was installed so that if the water heater broke the water would, hopefully, flow in that small space to the back door and then outside. Water heaters in those days did not have planned short life expectancy like they do today. In fact, my first 40 gallon water heater lasted in my home for over 40 years. Life expectancy now can be as short as 10 years.

Code requires that a retention pan be located under the water heater with a drain to the exterior of the house. I have seen some with the pan but without a drain to the exterior of the home. That could be very costly to you. Consider having your water heater located in your garage if at all possible, especially if it is currently located where an exterior wall is not nearby, and with a drain pipe from the pan to the outside of the house.

A further hot button in our homes is the wire connected to the garbage

disposal. Originally these were installed and the wire connecting them was not protected. Because so much stuff is stored under our sinks and some of it even sharp objects, there is the risk of wearing the insulation down to the bare wires. A simple fix is to cover it with a protective cover found at Home Depot or Lowe's so as to prevent damage to that wire casing.

I mention these items because they keep popping up in the inspection reports that I get. Again, these are things to look out for whether or not you are selling your home. They are safety items that make sense!



1 tsp. fresh gtound pepper


Instructions:
