GOOD NEWS: In the June 2025 meeting, the CRD budget was adopted for next year.

The budgeted annual tax assessment will remain the same (\$800) as promised in the CRD tax referendum project of 2022. No changes to this assessment is a good thing for all OC residents!

SALES CONTINUE: As the CRD works to ensure that as many residents as possible have them, sales of the electronic access fobs for White Sands Beach are ongoing. Rec Center hours for purchases are M-F, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Fobs are \$30 each with a limit of 2 per family.

Cash, check or credit card (with additional processing fees) are accepted.

Access control fobs are activated within 24 hours of purchase.

> **REMINDER:** Why did the CRD implement this system?

The new electronic key fob system is designed to be modern and is easy-to use. The goal is to provide safe, reliable access during operating hours to our shared space at White Sand Beach. Unlike keys, electronic access fobs are unable to be copied and shared.

Ultimately over time, the electronic fob will replace a few keys to various amenity areas and as a result there will be a cost savings to residents.

Come by the Rec Center to purchase your Electronic Access Fob today!



The Electronic Access Fob provides controlled entrance and exit for White Sands Beach.

The boat ramp and bathroom keys remain unchanged.

WHITE SANDS BEACH IS OPEN DAWN TO DUSK, with gates programmed accordingly. During the summer season, a guard will be present from noon to dusk, and gates will be open.

Per usual procedure, please show your ID for entrance to the beach through the open main gate. This allows for added security.

Keep your keys to other neighborhood areas too, like Scotty Cooper Park, Tennis Courts, Dog Park, etc. More info will come as future plans develop to include these areas with electronic access using the Fob for entry.

On the construction side, students can develop critical skills in: **Electrical Work, Plumbing, Masonry, and Carpentry.** These trades not only offer high-paying career paths but also prepare students to pursue a college degree in construction management.

Integrating Innovation and Entrepreneurship

The transformation does not stop at technical skills. Chamberlain's new identity will seamlessly blend these programs with its nationally recognized 3DE by Junior Achievement model, and the Cambridge University's Advanced International Certificate of Education (A.I.C.E.) offering real-world case-based learning and cross-disciplinary collaboration. Students who graduate with an AICE diploma get Pre-Paid Tuition to Florida Colleges!!

This fall, two groundbreaking spaces will open at Chamberlain to help students turn their dreams into reality. **Dream**

A Phased Rollout, Built for Student Success




