



OC REAL ESTATE REAL ESTATE - 101 OVERPRICING WITH A DIFFERENT TWIST

On a given day last month, I found that four of



the 11 homes listed For Sale had price reductions before they sold and were on the market between 73 and 250 days, while the other seven did not have to reduce their price and were under contract in 2-6 days. Overpricing your home doesn't get you more money. It simply delays the process and costs you more in maintenance expense, which also reduces your yield/profit.

As an example, the average mortgage for our area would be about \$1400, with taxes and insurance, it might equal \$1900 a month which you could be applying to your new home principal or investment accounts. Then there's pool service, which runs between \$50 and \$100 a month, plus yard service which would be between \$100 and \$150, and utilities at about \$300 a month. All of this adds up to about \$2,400 at a minimum not taking into account any possible repairs that might happen.

Let's say that there was a house on the market for nine months originally priced at \$367,500. If you take away \$21,600 (9 months at \$2,400/month), it would be as though you priced it at \$345,900 and had a faster sale. However, this house has been reduced in price to \$335,000 which makes it's real selling value now at \$313,400 (\$335,000- \$21,600). The real value of this house is worth more than that, but it now has what I often refer to as "the disease." That means when a property is on the market for an extended period of time, people become leery of the home and avoid it. Plus, you have to deal with the annoyance of having to be continually preparing your house for showings.

Then there is the appraisal process. Even if you get an offer at an excessive high price, you still have to face the reality that the appraiser is going to come in and appraise your house at a lower value, usually resulting in you having to lower your price to complete the deal. Appraisers have many criteria to use, but there are three primary features that they follow. 1) The house should be in a one-mile radius. 2) The house should be plus or minus 10% in square footage. 3) They avoid using properties sold more than six months ago. Using these characteristics on the home above with Original Carrollwood sales our square footage price range would be high \$173.62, average \$158.36, low \$112.57.

When you evaluate your home ask yourself, has everything been upgraded over the past five years including paint, kitchen, bathrooms, A/C, water heater, roofs, etc., with top of the line products? If so, then your house may fall in the high number. If not, then you have to look lower. An average home is well maintained with some upgrades and in excellent condition but maybe some of the key items like A/C's have some years on them. Hopefully, your

Realtor can help you determine this and, hopefully, you will listen to the expert.

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
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

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OC Resident Skates Way to Team USA

Eighteen year old Carrollwood resident, Cotton Yarborough, recently competed in Colorado Springs at the Olympic Training Center (OTC) in the Outdoor National Inline Speed Skating Championships. He competed for two long weeks at the OTC Velodrome track and on a road course to earn a Gold, Silver and Bronze medal in three separate events. This success made him one of only six skaters in the nation, in his age group, to qualify to represent his country on Team USA at

the World Championships. The competition, in Nanjing China, begins in late August and lasts for three weeks.

Preparing for this competition, Cotton persevered from being lapped at local league meets for years, and only dreaming of getting on the podium, to being a team leader/co-captain and

now a member of Team USA. While many of his friends and family were socializing and relaxing, Cotton could be found training on the track, in the gym, or on his bike. When he typed his

personal goals in 2013, his "dream goal" was to make Team USA. Who would have guessed four long years later he would actually achieve that goal? Nobody really, not his coaches, not his parents. Why? Because in 2013.

Cotton was still considered "heat meat" by the top skaters. A term used for a skater that pays his entry fees for races just to be lapped by the

top skaters, basically, funding their medals. After many years of loses and a late growth spurt, his training finally cam Cotton was presented with the need to raise \$6500 for travel, training and coaches expenses with just an eight-week notice. All prayers and support shall be greatly appreciated.
