4th of July Mobile Concert & Parade, Complete with Gwards:



Tampa native Joe Costa, a professional writer and educator, has lived in Florida his

Tampa Writer With Ybor City Roots Hammers Out A Book About Ybor City's Working Class.

On July 14, Unsolicited Press released Comets, a new book by Tampa writer and educator Joseph Allen Costa. Set in Ybor City, Comets is a collection of intertwining stories that examine the complexities of family and the ways that honor, tradition and responsibility create fissures in the human spirit. The book is based on the Ybor City cabinet shop his father owned for more than 60 years.

The twelve-story collection follows the life of Roberto, an angsty teen, who spends long days in his father's cabinet shop staring out the garage door looking for a way out of his bluecollar struggle. He is incredibly perceptive to small details. but blind to the comic and sometimes tragic lives of his coworkers. Of the book, one reviewer wrote that, Comets is a loving intergenerational look at Ybor City and the men who built it and were built by it. The collection is as insightful and satisfying and full of Lawrence's "subtle

interrelatedness" as any novel. It hums with buried circuitry.

Fueled by café con leche and Cuban sandwiches. Comets captures a microcosm of bluecollar problems with implications that go beyond racial, economic and cultural boundaries, illuminating a greater understanding of the human experiences we all share, while loss of childhood resonates as an overarching theme.

Joseph Allen Costa is a freelance writer and adjunct English professor in Tampa. He received his MFA in creative writing from the University of Tampa and his BA from the University of South Florida. Costa is the author of three novels, The Good, The Bad and The Goalie, Discovering Dynamite! Eye of the Storm, and one linked collection of short fiction, Comets. His short stories have appeared in BULL men's fiction, Rabble Lit, the HCE Review, The Write Launch and in December Magazine as a finalist for the Curt Johnson Prose Awards.

entire life except for the two years when he worked in NYC as a copywriter. When

he returned to Florida, he moved to OC where he has resided for the last 22 years.

Joe began writing when he was about eight years old. His family drove to Key West from Tampa and he tells the story, "On the long drive back, I had a pad and started writing about our trip. When I finished, it was five pages long and it all rhymed, badly. When I read it aloud, the family laughed hysterically. They thought it was brilliant. I'd found my place, and that was powerful."

Joe and his wife, Teresa, have two children. Their son, Cristo, is 16 and attends Tampa Catholic. Their daughter, Alessa, is 14 and attends Morning Star School of Tampa.

Joe says Carrollwood is Tampa's best-kept secret and his favorite thing about living in OC is that it is a great neighborhood to raise kids. He is particularly fond of the OC Halloween Parade. For the past two consecutive years, his son, Cristo, has won the Halloween costume contest in his category. The 4th of July Ski Show (which unfortunately was cancelled this year) is another favorite OC event, as well as hunting Easter eggs with his kids and, of course, watching the New Year's fireworks display. Joe also currently serves on the CRD Board.

Joe was born and raised in Tampa by parents (and grandparents) from Ybor City. He has a love of Italian and Cuban food. If he was able to have dinner with any author, dead or alive, he said, "I'd have dinner with Hemingway. I'd make carne asada with a spicy chimichurri, and we'd drink a good bottle of bourbon."

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
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A NEW SCHOOL YEAR

REAL ESTATE 101: FINANCE PROCESS

Often we're asked, "how soon should I start the financing process." In reality you should start the financing process before you begin your home search. You may think you know what you can afford but your financier may have a different opinion. So let's talk about some steps you need to take.

- 1. Don't just go to one mortgage company. Rates do vary. Bank closing costs do vary. You should be questioning your lenders credibility as much as your lender is questioning your financial capability.
- 2. You need to get a preapproval letter. Initially, get them to tell you your max, but when you submit an offer on a home notify your lender that you want that letter to reflect ONLY the amount that you're going to offer. You don't want to show all your capability to the seller because they will use that against you in negotiations. Sellers, don't assume that the approval letter you get is the maximum the buyer can spend.
- 3. The toughest time is when your mortgage request goes to underwriting. This is usually as little as 10 or less days before closing. If you've failed to disclose something in your financial disclosure, they will find it and now you have a big problem. It could change your financial limits drastically and cost you the home that you've fallen in love with.
- 4. Be careful about getting help with your down payment. Parents will often LOAN their children money for the down payment. That has to be disclosed and is taken into consideration

by the lender as part of your outstanding debt which could reduce the amount of monthly payment that you can afford thereby reducing the size of your loan.

5. As a seller you will want to question the financing capability of any buyer. Generally, ALL of the contract types have one glaring contingency that most people overlook. It's the financing contingency. Many people think that once they've crossed the inspection phase of the contract that they're home free. WRONG! If underwriting finds an error and it affects the amount of money to be loaned, the buyer either has to get the price reduced on the house or they can walk and get their escrow money back. In the process the seller has now lost all of that market time for their home.

So, in reality, know your financing capability before you start. Be totally complete with your information to the mortgage people. Failure to do this could really disrupt your lives.
