



Boating safety, driving tips

As our lake has gotten busier over the last few years, it is time to renew our focus on boating safety and etiquette on Lake Carroll. Follow these basic safety tips and enjoy Lake Carroll with family and friends.

BOATING SAFETY:

For more information and boat safety courses visit: myfwc.com/boating/safety-education

In order to operate a motorboat of ten (10) horsepower or greater, Florida law requires anyone who was born on or after Jan. 1, 1988, to successfully complete an approved boating safety course and obtain a Boating Safety Education Identification Card issued by the FWC.

Use and maintain the right safety equipment.

Have a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket for each person on board and one approved throwable device for any boat 16 feet and longer.

Be weather wise.

Keep a close eye on the weather. Sudden wind shifts, lightning flashes and choppy water all can mean a storm is brewing. If bad weather is approaching, get off the water early.

LAKE CARROLL: BOATING & PERSONAL WATERCRAFTS (PWC, JET SKI, SEA-DOO)

White Sand Beach area and the canals are considered a "NO WAKE ZONE." For safety of other boats and swimmers, enter and exit at a slow, safe speed.

Life jackets must be worn by all personal watercraft riders and skiers.

Always boat on Lake Carroll in a counterclockwise direction.



Check the boat traffic on the lake. If there are too many boats pulling skiers/tubes, then wait until a few skiers are done with their runs. The fewer boats operating with skiers on the lake, the safer it will be. Mornings and evenings are typically times with fewer boats on the water.

Never allow passengers to ride on the bow area of a boat, gunwales or outside of protective railings/seats, including the front of a pontoon boat. A sudden turn, stop or start could cause a fall overboard.

The main rule we see broken is boaters & PWCs (jet skis) following other boats pulling skiers/tubes entirely too close. Never follow directly behind another watercraft. PLEASE GIVE SKIERS and TUBES SPACE.



and Etiquette

PULLING SKIERS (SKIING, WAKEBOARDING, SURFING, TUBES)

All skiers/wakeboarders/surfers should wear a coast guard approved life jacket.


Use a spotter and/or a large mirror and be aware of other boats in your area.

Keep your skier a safe distance from all docks, boats, structures, paddleboarders, kayakers, etc.

Avoid Power Turns: When a skier falls, make sure to come off the throttle and slowly turn/approach your skier. This is unsafe and throws more wakes throughout the lake. The only time a power turn is recommended is if you are in a busy area with approaching boats or a skier could be injured.

BOATING ETIQUETTE TIPS

When wakesurfing or driving a larger boat that



can create a large wake:

Stay at least 150 feet away from structures or shore; this allows your wake to dissipate before impacting the shore & docks.

Avoid close passes to other boats,

paddleboards, kayaks and docks.

Keep music at a responsible level. Sound travels much farther than you think on the water and loud music can ruin other boaters' and homeowners' peace and quiet.

Finally, be aware of how your wake is affecting others. In addition to other boaters, docks and shoreside properties, this applies to other watersports enthusiasts too. When you pick up a downed rider, do not remain at surfing speed and make a big looping turn back toward the person in the water.

Please share these safety and driving tips with others on Lake Carroll, including boaters that are not in Original Carrollwood.

Follow these basic tips and everyone will enjoy their time on the water we share.

Share the water responsibly & watch your wake.

Mom's Parm Crusted Chicken

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 450F.
- Whisk all marinade ingredients together until well combined and uniform in consistency.
- Place marinade and chicken in gallon freezer bag. Seal out air and roll bag to evenly coat chicken. Refrigerate at least 30 minutes or overnight.
- Sear chicken: Heat 2T. olive oil in skillet (iron skillet is best) over medium-high heat. Sear chicken about 3-5 minutes each side. Salt and pepper (if desired). Once seared, remove from heat, set aside.
- Combine chopped parmesan, provolone and 1/2 cup Ranch dressing in small bowl. Microwave for about 30 seconds.
 Use back of fork to mash and stir the cheese mixture until about consistency of lumpy mashed potatoes. Microwave an additional 15 seconds. Stir and spread on top of seared chicken pieces.
- Bake until cheese is hot and melted, about 3-5 minutes.
- Melt 5T. butter in microwave, about 30 seconds.
- Combine panko with garlic powder. Stir in melted butter and top the cheesecovered chicken.
- Bake for about 2 minutes until top of panko starts to lightly brown. (Keep close eye on panko to ensure it doesn't burn.)
- Garnish with chopped scallions.

- 4 skinless/boneless chicken breasts, pounded to 3/4 inch thick (or easy method: 2 thick ones sliced in half — no pounding needed— keep same thickness to cook evenly)
- 2 Tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- Salt/pepper, to taste (if desired)

Marinade:

- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1/2 cup Ranch salad dressing (Mom used homemade Ranch dressing recipe here)
- 3 Tablespoons worcestershire
- 1 teaspoon white vinegar
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1 Tablespoon minced garlic
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper

Parmesan (rust:

- 3/4 cup parmesan cheese chopped into bits
- 3/4 cup provolone cheese chopped into bits
- 6 Tablespoons Ranch salad dressing
- 5 Tablespoons melted butter
- 1 cup panko bread crumbs
- 1 Tablespoon garlic powder

Garrish: (optional)

• 4 Scallions — chopped

Homemade Ranch Dressing Servings: 24 1-Tablespoon servings (recipe makes about 1 1/2 cups)

Tastes better than anything you can buy in

Ingredients: (Adjust herbs to taste)

1/2 cup mayonnaise

1/2 cup sour cream

1/2 cup buttermilk or regular milk

1/2 teaspoon dried dill weed

1 teaspoon dried parsley

1 teaspoon dried chives

1 teaspoon onion powder

1 teaspoon garlic powder

1 teaspoon cracked pepper

1 teaspoon cracked bebbe

1/4 teaspoon fine sea salt

1 - 3 teaspoons freshly squeezed lemon juice or white vinegar (adjust to taste)

— Whisk together the mayo, sour cream and milk until smooth. Add spices and whisk until combined. Add the lemon and whisk again. Pour into a jar and chill in the refrigerator until ready to serve. Will keep refrigorated up to two weeks.

Regular Pruning & Maintenance

Regular pruning has several benefits. It promotes healthy growth and removes dead, dying, or diseased limbs.

Assess your trees, paying close attention to the branches, and remove limbs that are dying or damaged. Thinning or reducing the crown can reduce trunk movement during a hurricane. You can also prune to reshape the tree. When done correctly, reshaping can make trees more resistant to wind damage. If branches are large or high in the tree, seek help. It's best to hire a certified arborist to prune.

While watering your gardens this month, turn the hose on yourself and stay cool. Work outside in the early hours of the day before the real heat sets in. Stay hydrated and stay cool. Watch for early warning signs of heat exhaustion or heat stroke, and if they appear go in and get cooled down! 
