





White Sands Beach















Having lived through the Revolution, Bay of Pigs Affair and Cuban Missile Crisis, sailing into Havana Harbor on Aug. 22 was a "pinch me" moment. The movie, *Godfather 2*, chillingly depicted that fateful New Year's Eve 1959 when Cuba would change forever. With our President's recent rapprochement, the door has now opened for us to explore this complex neighbor.

As Tampa residents, we celebrate the Cuban heritage here--Ybor City, the cigar factory and La Tropicana are priority stops when showing friends our city.

On our Fathom cruise to Cuba, we saw Tampa's hero, Jose Marti, front and center in every port. The poet/journalist was born in Havana in 1853 to Spanish parents, yet kindled the flames of Cuba's independence and united the Cuban forces to victory in the Spanish-American war (1895-98).

Fathom offered a Florida resident rate for Aug/Sept of \$1600 per person for a balcony cabin, and this enticed us to go now rather than in the winter when prices are more than doubled. Fathom at 700 passengers sails from Miami, alternating people-to-people experiential cruises to Cuba and the Dom. Rep. You need a visa and are required to participate in the complimentary planned excursions. The only optional add-on is a choice of cabaret shows: Havana's famous Nacional Hotel or the Tropicana Club where men and women in high headdresses dance to pounding Cuban tones.

The refurbished ship's traditional decor sports warm wood interiors. Service is polished, and cuisine offers American, Latin and Indian flavors. The entertainment was weak: This is a learning experience -







without the usual bingo, production shows and *Newlywed Game.* 

Story-telling workshops and Spanish

conversation were two lecture highlights. On shore, we traveled in China-made, modern air-conditioned busses. Local guides spoke excellent English, and while they initially included the words, "triumph of the revolution," later candidly shared hope of bringing their country into the 21st century.

We were treated to lunches in paladares - family-owned cafes and restaurants that surfaced within the last five years when the government allowed individuals to start their own businesses. Platters of fresh chicken, pork and shrimp with white (not yellow) rice and black beans were staples at each table. Servers engaged us in English, but the welcome was 100% Cuban.

After two scorching but intriguing days in Havana, we docked in Cienfuegos, Pearl of the South. Our walking tour past French-influenced neoclassical buildings in ice cream colors included a performance at the Teatro Tomas Terry. Even members of the *Cantores Chorale* singing a cappella were wiping their brows in the 950-seat auditorium embellished with Carrara marble, hand-carved hardwoods and whimsical ceiling frescoes. Fans helped, but we were glad to return to our air-conditioned ship.

In Santiago, the former capital, a plaque on San Juan Hill honors the role of Teddy Roosevelt and the Rough Riders in Cuba's battle with Spain. We enjoyed Cutumba and Macumba dance in a community arts center. In the early 1900s, about a million Africans were brought as slaves to staff all phases of the booming sugar industry. Their influence is seen in Cuba's music, art, and primary religion called "Santeria" which is a merging of their gods' identities with Roman Catholic saints.

Should you go now while the country is in neutral where colorful, historic Pontiac and Oldsmobile convertibles will whisk you through neighborhoods frozen in the 50's? Or wait until the explosion of tourism leads to a new infrastructure of resort hotels and activities?

Consider both! We're so close to Cuba in geography as well as history that a return in 5-10 years will ultimately show how new flights,

tours and cruise options have improved the lives of the Cuban people by creating jobs and a window to the world.

Refreshments and snacks will be served at the park immediately following the parade. We will promptly begin giving the well


deserved accolades and awards to the winners of the following categories:

The month of October is often associated with strong jovial feelings as children and adults alike look forward to the feeling of fresh fall air, Halloween celebrations, and sweet treats. However, the month of October also elicits other intense feelings from people as well—especially from sufferers and survivors alike. October is Breast Cancer Awareness month.

One in eight — this is the number of women whose lives will be drastically altered by a diagnosis of breast cancer sometime during their life. Tragically, this horrific disease, which brutally impacts their mental, physical, and emotion wellbeing, causes nearly 40,000 deaths per year. As a result, 40,000 patients suffer terrible fates and 40,000 families are left mourning. However, there is hope! Breast Cancer Awareness Month is passionately dedicated to the prevention of such tragedies and has had great results. Through this annual campaign, people join together to expand the awareness of breast cancer with the hope of increasing chances of early detection. It is through early detection that one's chances of beating this disease increases twofold. Therefore, it is important to know one's risks of developing breast cancer in addition to the common warning signs.

The main risk factors for developing breast cancer include getting older, drinking alcohol excessively, family history of the disease, taking oral contraceptives, not being physically active, and inherited mutations in one's genes (BRCA1 and BRCA2). However, one can drastically reduce their chances of developing breast cancer by exercising

regularly, maintaining a healthy weight, and limiting or stopping alcohol consumption and oral contraceptives.

Thankfully, due to the use of regular mammogram screenings, most cases of breast cancer are found in their early stages — often before any warning signs even appear. However, all breast cancers are not always easily detected by a mammogram. Therefore, it is important to be aware of the common warning signs which could indicate the potential presence of the disease. Below is a list is common warning signs to familiarize oneself with:

- Swelling of all or part of a breast
- Skin irritation or dimpling
- Breast or nipple pain
- Retraction (turning inward)
- Redness or scaliness of skin
- Nipple discharge
- Red or swollen lymph nodes

If you experience any of the common symptoms or are concerned about your health, please contact your doctor or a local specialist and schedule an appointment.



# OC REAL ESTATE SELLING YOUR HOME - 101 Downsizing????

I'm frequently approached by prospective clients who think

they are interested in downsizing.

Sometimes that's a tough call. There are many reasons for doing that; children going away to school, death of a spouse, financial scrutiny, but is it the right choice and when is the right time? Only you can make that decision, but it needs to be thought out carefully.

First of all, selection of your new digs is paramount. Over the years, many have chosen to go into retirement complexes where you pay substantial sums of money for a small apartment with purportedly a small portion of that being returned to your estate or to you if you chose to move. As we have discovered lately in one of the local complexes, improper administration of those funds often causes them to disappear and you are left with nothing and the inability to move on.

Many would like to go from a single

family home to a townhouse, villa, or condo. When seeking out these places, we are quick to evaluate the monthly HOA/maintenance fee to get the least expensive. As seen in the Village lately, that can prove to be costly. When major repairs are required and HOA funds are not available, there is only one choice the HOA board is left with and that's a stiff assessment, and you as a homeowner MUST pay it or face the consequences of having a lien placed on your property prohibiting you from selling the property until the lien is satisfied. So finding a community with a low monthly HOA payment is not always the best answer.

However, there is often an upside. You eliminate pool maintenance expenses, yard service, often costs of water, painting of the exterior, new roofs, reduced insurance rates, etc., etc. Those things are now parts of the HOA, so while you are paying for them indirectly, you are sharing that cost with several other people and therefore it should be less. Then there is the freedom of responsibility of these things because the board and the management company are the caretakers. For example, you can take a vacation in February and March rather than having to stay home to keep the oak leaves from clogging up the pool and burning out the motor.

Have I depressed you? I hope not. Just be sure you do your homework, FIRST.

The CRD Board is now issuing new boat decals and keys to the boat ramp at White Sands Beach. If you apply and pay before Halloween (October 31), you will be issued the new key and decal at the time of your application (Note: for those who are already on file with the CRD.) After Halloween, it will be by appointment only. Allow up to 2-weeks for your appointment. The cost will be \$45.00, with additional decals costing \$5 each, for families with multiple vessels.

The new lock will be installed on November 1. After this date, the old key will no longer be needed.

Did you know that standing water around your home can support the breeding of mosquitoes? Mosquitoes breed by laying eggs in and near standing water. As little as one teaspoon or bottle cap of water standing for more than one week is enough for mosquitoes to breed and multiply. Additionally, many bothersome mosquitoes typically only travel a few hundred feet from their breeding site.


### Mosquitos

You can help stop mosquitoes from breeding by using these tips:

- At least once a week, empty, turn over or cover anything that could hold water: tires, buckets, toys, pools and pool covers, birdbaths, trash containers, recycling bins, boat or car covers, roof gutters, coolers, and pet dishes.
- Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances, and other items that may collect water.
- Put away items that are outside and not being used because they could hold standing water.

- Keep flower pots and saucers free of standing water.
   Some plants, such as bromeliads, hold water in their leaves—flush out water-holding plants with your hose once a week.
- Maintain swimming pools in good condition and chlorination.
