I am pleased to announce that the CRD closed out the 2016-2017 fiscal year ending September 30, 2017, as follows: Total revenue was \$561,931.83 with total expenses of \$558,833.86. The budgeted amount was \$590,950, of which \$45,055 was to come from accumulated funds; however, it was not necessary to draw from accumulated funds.

To begin the new fiscal year, the Board awarded five contracts at the October meeting. Look for wall repair work at White Sands Beach, painting at Scotty Cooper Park, two new air conditioning units to be installed at the Recreation Center, and holiday lights. Also, a contract was awarded to replace the pump and motor for the irrigation well at Scotty Cooper Park. This well supplies water to irrigate the median along Lake Carroll Way, from Scotty Cooper Park to Bank of America.

Additionally, there were seven residents in attendance to ask various questions, mainly related to Original Carrollwood Park. OCP Chairman Mike Carelli will do some research about the possibility of adding batting cages. If you are interested, please attend the November CRD Meeting to hear his recommendation. Mortgage Process

In times like these when mortgage rates are so low, many will re-fi there homes to get



lower monthly payments. This can be a time consuming and confusing process, but there are ways to minimize the frustration. Here are some of the items typically required for loan approval:

- Copy of your homeowner's insurance or your home insurance agent's contact information.
- Pay stubs for the most recent 30 days for all borrowers on the application.
- Signed personal federal income tax

- returns, including all Schedules (A, B, C, D, E), for the past two years.
- W-2s/1099s for all employers for the past two years.
- Two months of current statements for all bank and asset accounts (mutual funds, retirement, stock) showing balances and account numbers

 to include all pages of the bank statements and explain/document any large (could be as low as \$250) bank deposits in a separate letter.
- Landlord history for the previous 2 years including name, address and phone number, as well as the monthly rent amount.
- Any additional financial records that may be relevant to the qualification, including any bankruptcy, separation papers, divorce decree, or judgments/ collection payments. Documentation of receipt of alimony/child support payments needs to be provided only when you use it as income for loan qualification purposes.
- Insurance, tax and mortgage statements for any other properties you own (if applicable).

In conjunction with the above, there are some addition actions you need to take during the rest of your loan process in order to make it go smoothly:

- Refrain from taking out any new loans.
- Make all existing bill payments on time.
- Refrain from making any major job changes (i.e., become self employed, change pay structure, etc.).
- Refrain from making any major changes in your assets (selling/ buying).
- · Avoid credit inquiries.

By the way, none of this is free. The government has its hand out and the lender will also intend to make money up front, as well as, during the life of

the mortgage. Get disclosure up front BEFORE you move out so that you are certain this is the correct thing for you to do. You might be lowering your monthly bill, but you also may be adding on significantly to the life of the contract. Hopefully, your objective is to OWN your home someday free and clear of all indebtedness. Don't just look at today. Look down the road 30 years.




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

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Do you Suffer from Money Silence?

Part One of a Two-Part Series

The holiday shopping season and year's end is a breeding ground for couples to disagree about financial decisions. In many ways, the stress often leads to money silence, the avoidance or breakdown of financial communication. Author and wealth psychologist, Kathleen Burns Kingsbury, has written a book, *Breaking Money Silence*, where she addresses the scope of the problem and offers solutions for couples to move past uncomfortable financial interactions.

Is this really a thing?

Before you can begin to work on any problem, you have to admit that one exists. The numbers and stories seem to say there is a serious problem at work.

Did you know that couples are more willing to talk about death, politics, and religion before they talk about money? You read that right. People would rather speak about death than their finances. Financial disagreements are the most-cited reason for ending relationships. A recent survey done by Fidelity Investments found that four in ten people could not identify their partner's salary.

Understand that being on the same page financially is not just about the dollars and cents.

The forces at play range from emotional issues (like security, validation, comfort) and personality types (like natural savers or spenders) to past experiences and family financial values that were observed. Money silence may help you avoid uncomfortable conversations today, but this catches up to you eventually.

In the next article in this series, I'll offer up some simple steps you can take. But for now, be encouraged. Financial communication, like any other aspect of your relationships, can get better with practice. Take stock in the intangible assets, anticipate change coming to you and take the time to prepare in advance.
