The CRD Board ended its fiscal year on September 30 and here is a brief financial recap of those 12 months.

The amount we had budgeted to spend was \$631,802.00; however, when Covid hit, we anticipated lost income because we were unable to rent the Recreation Center and also unable to allow softball teams to lease the OCP ball field. So our total expenses ending September 30 were \$607,091.00 (we reduced discretionary spending due to Covid). We do not just plan year to year, but have a five-year plan thanks to former Board member Mickey Jaap who is a certified public accountant. When Mickey left the CRD Board, he passed the five-year projection over to current Board member Mike Carelli (who is a wealth management professional) to ensure the continuity continues. In addition, newest Board member & Treasurer Mark Georgiades is wasting no time with scheduling the annual audit, which is already underway. Mark G. is also a spending hawk, so it makes for a good team.

A brief October meeting recap: the Board awarded a contract for parking lot sealcoating, restriping, and repairs at White Sands Beach & the Recreation Center, so look for this work to begin (most likely) during the holidays. We need to wait and get out of the rainy season. In addition, thanks to Samara Drive

resident Betty Owen, for bringing to our attention that some of the island lighting remains on during the daytime hours. These lights are on photocells, so multiple island repairs have been made throughout our community by the time you read this article.

In closing, Happy Halloween and Happy Thanksgiving!

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

It likely won't last through our hot summers so should be treated as an annual in our area and is best grown in containers close to the house so as to enjoy their delicate blue color. They like light shade and to be kept moist. If you can't find them locally (if you do, let me know!) you can mail order from Spring Hill Nursery, Michigan Bulb, or White Flower Farm.

TAMPA'S HOT REAL ESTATE MARKET

Come prices have increased at an accelerated rate due to low interest rates and strong buyer demand. With the CO-VID-19 outbreak, there has also been a surge of northeasterners relocating to our sunshine state, especially for those entering retirement. Brick and mortar companies are beginning to offer a more flexible or optional work from home, even as we enter into COVID-19, phase 3. The snowbirds are starting

to call Florida their primary residence leaving behind state income taxes, high property taxes, and colder climates.

Tampa's average sale price this past September was \$378,296; this rose 18% from \$308,450 in 2019. The average days on market last year was 41 days with 46 days to close; whereas, this year we had a 10% decrease of days on market and a 6.5% decrease for days to close (MLS Data).

To put this into perspective, last year's 30-year fixed mortgage rates averaged to be 3.94%. The current buyers I am working with have locked in a 2.75% interest rate.

To incorporate the above statistics average annual home sales (assuming for practical purposes, a VA loan with a 0% down payment), the interest paid for 2020 is \$184,914; whereas, in 2019, it was \$217,848. That is \$32,934 savings in interest paid over a 30-year fixed loan compared to purchasing a home last year.

A client of mine recently made the remark, the market is moving faster than my mind can process. This is very much true. According to the Tampa Bay Times, home prices in Tampa rose 4.9% last year. This has outpaced increases among all 20 major U.S. markets except Phoenix. Miami was the only other Florida city in the top 20, posting at an increase of 3.3%. Roughly 950 Americans are moving to Florida every day, and this is not expected to subside. Based on Tampa Hillsborough Economic Development Corporation, Tampa is projected to grow at least 4% annually over the next few years. Therefore, regardless of high demand and increase in prices, today's low interest rate environment will save buyers in interest paid for the longterm. 💿

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Ingredients: (Makes one dozen)

- 2 Cups flour
- 1/2 Cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 Cup brown sugar
- 2 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/3 teaspoon salt
- 1 Cup milk (Buttermilk would be terrific if on hand)
- 1/4 Cup melted butter
- 1 Egg, beaten

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- 11/2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- 1/2 Cup cored, peeled and diced apples (Gala or Granny Smith work well)
- 12 Caramels unwrapped and diced
- Optional: 1 Tub cream cheese frosting

Muffins Directions:

Cipple Caramel

- Combine flour, sugars, cinnamon, nutmeg, baking powder and salt in large bowl.
- In separate large bowl, mix together milk, melted butter, beaten egg and vanilla. Add flour mixture stirring just until blended. Stir in apples and caramels.
- Divide batter evenly into 12 paper-lined muffin cups.
- Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes or until tops spring back when lightly touched
- Serve warm, or cooled with toppings of choice. See some options to the right.

Make it a cupcake! Cool completely before topping with cream cheese frosting.

Drizzle with caramel sauce, add chopped nuts, dust with nutmeg, or (and!) chocolate sprinkles!

> Serve with whipped cream or a dusting of powdered sugar.

> > Extra (?!) muffins can be wrapped and kept in the freezer for up to a month.
