GUARD SCHEDULING CHANGE FOR FALL/WINTER SEASON:

- Beginning Nov. 3, a guard will be on duty Friday, Saturday and Sundays only to assist residents from noon to dusk.
- White sands beach access gates are closed 24/7.
- Gates will open to residents with fobs during beach hours.
- Unauthorized use of the fobs is prohibited.

GATES ARE **PROGRAMMED FOR BEACH HOURS**

The electronic access fob will open and access gates during specific hours only - dawn to dusk. The exit gate is programmed to open when the ground sensor is activated by a vehicle (golf cart or car/truck) and gate closes automatically after each time.

HOW OUR GATES WORK:

Access our gates with the access control fob:

- Main Gate: Hold the fob to the screen at bottom where indicated until it opens and "Access Granted" displays on the screen.
- Pedestrian Gate: Hold fob where indicated on the side of the gate until you hear the sound of the gate unlock.

SALES CONTINUE

The CRD wants to ensure that as many residents as possible have a fob

- Rec Center hours for purchases are M-F, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- Fobs are \$30 each with a limit of 2 per family.
- · Cash, check or credit card (with additional processing fees) are accepted.
- Access control fobs are activated within 24-hours of purchase.

George McLauchlin | Navy

I served onboard The USS Tom Green County LST-1159 from August 1968 to December 1970 as a US Navy Ensign and Lt. Junior Grade. The ship was home ported out of Yokosuka, Japan, and was regularly deployed to service in Viet Nam.

I was the gunnery officer and later

1st Lieutenant (the officer over the deck, boats, tank deck, loading equipment and guns). I also served as the Officer of the Deck (OOD) (ship driver).

We mostly saw action in the Mekong Delta where the ship served as housing for the ninth infantry which was engaged with the Viet Cong in the area south of Saigon (now Ho Chi Min City). We were hit on several occasions by 57mm recoilless rifle fire and while beached at Vung Tau for resupply, we took a 140mm rocket in the fan tail which wiped out the kitchen and mess decks and killed three of the kitchen staff. The ship's steering system was disabled, and we needed to limp back to Yokosuka Naval Base dry dock for repairs.

The ship also did a tour of Market Time (the interception of Viet Cong maritime resupply craft). We also served with Ready Group Alpha off the coast of the DMZ always ready to beach our embarked Marine Corp Unit upon command.

Air Force | Master Sergeant (MSgt)

I joined the Air Force in 1990 and was stationed in Turkey during Desert Storm. After that, I served at Hurlburt Field, FL, as part of the Air Force Special Operations Command. I also spent time at MacDill Air Force Base with the United States Special Operations Command and concluded my service at the National Security Agency in 2010. I met my wife while serving in the Air Force, and

while serving in the Air Force, and our daughter was born at Offutt Air Force Base in Nebraska. I could not have completed my 20 years of service without my wife by my side—she truly is a rock star. During my career, I was awarded several medals: The National Defense Medal - Defense Meritorious Service Medal - Southwest Asia Service Medal - Global War on Terrorism Medal - Humanitarian Service Medal - Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal - Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Medal.

Andy Fonda | Air Force

I recently interviewed OC Resident and Air Force veteran, Andrew Fonda, who lives on Phoenix Circle. He says that is the best street in Original Carrollwood! It was an amazing experience learning about his time in the Air Force which was in total 28 years with active duty and Air Force Reserve. He originally enlisted in the Air Force at the age of 21, driven by a sense of patriotic duty to his country, and to qualify for the GI Bill.

He told me about his memorable experiences in the Air Force. His most vivid memory was when he first stepped off the bus, standing in line, and the next thing he knew, he had a drill sergeant yelling in his face. Another memorable experience was when he was invited to attend the Officer Candidate School (OCS). Because he joined the Air Force as an enlistee, he started at the very bottom, so retiring as a Major was special.

Mr. Fonda was very open about his experiences in the Air Force, such as when he was deployed during Desert Storm, which was when America went to fight against Iraq. He flew an aerovac, an in-air hospital that helps people treat injuries. Another memory is that right after 9/11, he was working as a communication officer in the Special Operations Command at MacDill Air Force Base and ended up being deployed a couple of times into some hostile

environments, primarily around Afghanistan.

While we talked, I asked about the challenges and experiences that shaped him as a person. He spoke about how the military helped him become a leader, a better communicator, a better father, a more effective businessman, and a more engaged community member. For example, he served on the Board in Original Carrollwood. For much of his success, he credits his military career.

We also discussed some challenges he faced while in service and how he overcame them. He discussed the importance of keeping his family together and how effective communication played a role. Another challenge was working to get promoted and striving for better opportunities. He learned to work harder and step back, if necessary, before trying again.

We then discussed what he was grateful for; he expressed gratitude for his family, especially his sons, as well as all the people in his life. His involvement with The American Legion, which has a chapter on Florida Avenue, allows him to collaborate with other retired military personnel. When asked what makes him thankful to live in Original Carrollwood, he said he appreciated that it is a very tight-knit community, that he has many friends, and that it was an amazing place to raise his sons.

Korean War. He was told he would fly from Washington, D.C. to San Francisco. then Hawaii, Japan and on to North Korea. Bob flew in MATS, the military airline, with about

110 others. The

flight crash landed

in the water just short of Hawaii when the plane ran out of fuel. There were injuries and loss of lives. He was placed with others in a Quonset hut for two days, and given new clothes. A Marine colonel came by and told him that he had experienced enough, and that he would stay in Hawaii. He was there for about 23 months.

Jack O'Brien | Air Force

Mr. O'Brien is a long-time resident of Original Carrollwood, as he came to our community in 1969. Before settling here, he served in the United States Air Force as a First Lieutenant. During his time in the Air Force, he worked as a Logistics Officer and a Recruiting and Retention Officer.

In the course of his service, Mr. O'Brien served in a 300-person medical unit. This group was called a M.U.S.T. Unit, also known as a Medical Unit Self-Contained/Transportable.

It had 100 beds with approximately 10 doctors and 20 nurses. This important unit was responsible for coordinating, transporting, and setting up a combat support hospital during the Vietnam War.

It was interesting learning about this part of the military system. He told me that this unit was like what was shown in the old TV sitcom M.A.S.H. which means Mobile Army Surgical Hospital, which when searched up showed transportable medical units that were used during the Korean War. Many thanks to him for his service to our country and our community!

Daniel Tomczak | Navy



Navy Storekeeper 3rd Class | WWII. Living in Buffalo N.Y., at 17 years old, Mr. Tomczak signed up for service with US Navy. When he turned 18, he was called for service. He attended Basic Training at Sampson U.S. Naval Training Station, in Romulus, New York. After Basic Training, he went to Chicago for school at Great Lakes, Ilinois, before being assigned to the LST-700 Advance Amphibian Force.

The original mission, to invade Japan, was circumvented by Japan's surrender, so the LST-700 crew was reassisgned to occupation duty in Korea, Japan, and China until mid-March 1946, escorting Japanese prisoners and civilians back to their homeland at Sasebo, Japan and Tsingtao, China (modern day



Qingdao.) After the mission was complete, they returned to the United States, in San Fransisco, picking up equipment from Pearl Harbor and other locations along the way.

Mr. Tomczak moved to Original Carrollwood in June 1989, and is a parishioner of St. Paul's Catholic Church. He is 98 years old and the last known survivor of the LST-700.


