

### Tis the Season... Luminaria 2014 is here!

My favorite time of year when the entire community comes out and demonstrates why we live in the best neighborhood in the Country! From the feedback from the residents, we will again sell the luminary kits from the Recreation Office.

Please keep in mind that the Recreation Center has new office hours. 3:30 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. Monday-Friday. The week of Christmas the Recreation Center will open for extended hours.

Monday, Dec. 22 - 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 23 - 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 24 - 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

This year, the cost will be \$10 per kit. These kits will have 20 candles, candle holders, and paper bags. We are looking at a number of wholesalers; we want the best quality at the best price. The luminary kits will be available the first week of December.

The sand will be delivered to White Sands sometime between Monday and Tuesday. We will send out a Crime Watch email blast when the sand is delivered.

Dear Friend of LAKEWATCH.

September 29, 2014

Florida LAKEWATCH records show that Carroll in Hillsborough County has been sampled by LAKEWATCH volunteers for a total of 137 months. The raw data are enclosed in this Data Report as tables and graphs. As you look through the Data Report, you may ask "What do these numbers mean?" or "How can this information be useful to me?" We've provided you with the following summaries that describe two common ways in which your LAKEWATCH data can be used.

The first summary, the Trophic State Summary describes how and why Carroll is classified into one of four categories called Trophic States. The second summary, Florida Lake Regions Summary, places Carroll into one of forty-seven Florida Lake Regions.

In addition to these summaries the following handouts are available upon request or can be downloaded from our web page if you would like more information about how to interpret the data, trophic states or take regions:

- Explanation of the Florida LAKEWATCH Data Packet teads you through the tables and graphs and shows you how to spot trends and patterns;
- Trophic State: A Waterbody's Ability to Support Plants, Fish, and Wildlife explains the four trophic states used by the Florida LAKEWATCH program;
- Florida Lake Regions: A Classification System explains the development of 47 Florida Lake Regions and discusses why it's important for you to know which Lake Region your take is in.

We realize that this is a lot of reading material. However, being familiar with this information can help you become more effective in the water management arena. For example, you can communicate more effectively with water management professionals; develop management goals for your water body; establish a baseline of water chemistry for future reference; or document changes that might be occurring.

We encourage you to share information from your data packet with others so they can become better informed. We can provide data in printed form, on computer disk, or via e-mail. Please don't hesitate to call us with your questions or comments.





### OC REAL ESTATE SELLING YOUR HOME 101

#### **Holiday Period**

There are many pros and cons dealing with listing and selling your home in November and December. With all the many activities going



on, will there be time to show the home? Then there's the clutter of decorations that often give the house an entirely different appearance. Let's not forget about the importance of the first 60 days of listing, and buyers tend to hunker down until the holidays are over.

Some people will have more time to look due to increased time off from work. That often brings out the "tire kickers" as well. These are people who just want to look but are not often serious buyers. But there are also people who are considering a job change who want to use that time to explore without their current employer being aware.

Sales records compiled by the Greater Tampa Board of Realtors reflect a 20% to 25% drop off in sales during the November and December periods. That makes the assumption that homes sold in November and December will close in January and February. Closings in March, April, May and June are typically at their peak. This means that sales significantly improve during the January and February time frame and stay strong until late summer.

So, it's your call. Obviously, we as Realtors will be happy to take your listing whenever it's available, but in the real world, these two holiday months are not the best time to move your property.

## ANSWER & SOLUTION to the November Coin Counting Puzzle:

From "Readers Digest," August, 2013

Jones gives Smith as many coins as Smith has.

Smith then gives Jones as many coins as Jones has remaining. Now Jones has 36 coins, and Smith has 42 coins. How many coins did each of them have to begin with?

#### ANSWER: Jones had 48, and Smith had 30.

The Solution:

Let J have x coins to begin with, and let S have y coins to begin with.

After the first transaction (during which "J gives S as many coins as S has", J has x-y coins and S has 2y coins

After the second transaction (during which "S gives J as many coins as J has remaining"), J has 2(x-y) = 36 coins and S has 2y - (x-y) = 42 coins.

Thus we have the two equations 2(x-y) = 36 and 2y - (x-y) = 42. Solving these two equations simultaneously gives the desired answer.

As a check, note that initially the total number of coins was 48 + 30 = 78, and that the final total was 36 + 42 = 78.
