Just when you think you've heard it all another surprise hits you right in the face. I was working with



a client the other day in Orlando. We had worked together on the sale of her home in Tampa and then she moved to Orlando where I had another associate of mine help her find that home. Well. now she has decided to come back to Tampa.

Another Realtor contacted her in Orlando after having heard that she was thinking about moving. He assured her that he had a client in Canada

who wanted her condo and would she consider selling to his client. After encouraging her to contact the Realtor she had worked with before since that sale had gone very well, we discovered a scam that was beginning to shake out in the Orlando area.

It seems that there are a lot of investors and flippers seeking properties in her particular area to rent to tourists. All of this makes a lot of sense. But, these buyers are making offers acceptable to the sellers, and then the game begins. It seems that what they are doing is getting their preferred inspectors to come in and finding fault with big-ticket items (roofs, termites, electrical, plumbing, etc.). For example, the 4-point items that I have discussed in previous articles. In the meantime, they wait until the last minute to advise the seller of these problems. By this time the seller has already placed another property under contract for their new residence so now they are under a little pressure to fix the problem. The buyer then comes back and says, "Don't worry, I'll fix it after I close, but you'll have to reduce your selling price by \$5.000.00" or whatever he deems the cost to be.

The problem is, there were no termites, or the roof wasn't ready to fall apart, or they didn't have a major electrical problem. The buyer is simply scamming the seller to reduce the price of the house. The best way to protect yourself if you feel the inspector isn't correct is to have someone come in and re-inspect to confirm or deny the claim. That'll cost you a couple of hundred dollars, but it might save you several thousand.

I am not suggesting that all inspectors are doing these things; however, it is happening, and you need to be aware of it. I have read many inspection reports, and unfortunately many are using programs that simplify their task but scare the buyers and sellers needlessly.

The words "could" and "might" and "may" are non-committal and give the inspector a way out. Enough of this! I will reserve other thoughts concerning inspections for another report.

However, be cognizant of scams!



How to Move Past Money Silence

Part Two of a Two-Part Series

The holiday shopping season and year's end is a breeding ground for couples to disagree about financial decisions. In many ways, the stress often leads to money silence, the avoidance or breakdown of financial communication. Author and wealth psychologist Kathleen Burns Kingsbury has written a book, *Breaking Money Silence*, where she addresses the scope of the problem and offers solutions for couples to move past uncomfortable financial interactions.

Before you can begin the process of moving past money silence, a few basics:

- We all have a unique history and experiences that have shaped our ideas and emotions about money (a money script).
- 2. It's very likely that your partner does not share the same money script you do, and thus conflict occurs.



3. Conflict resolution skills can be learned and practiced over time.

With that back drop, here are two keys to dealing with financial conflict.

Be an Active Listener

The goal of active listening is to put yourself in the other person's shoes. In financial conversations, this means doing your best to really understand your partner's money script. Ask open-ended questions, ask clarifying questions,





Typing Our Way to Forgetfulness

We all take notes. Whether you are a student taking notes in class, an employee taking notes in a meeting, or you're simply making a note of what you need from the store, we do it constantly. However, sometimes we easily forget the information from the notes, even if they were written earlier that same day. Why does this happen?

Sometimes, school, work, or responsibilities can become tiring. So instead of using up more time and energy to handwrite notes, typing them on your computer or phone often seems like the easier option. However, while typing notes may seem more efficient, handwriting your notes will actually save you more time and effort in the long run by improving both information processing and memory; thus, reducing the amount of information forgotten.

According to Fortune Magazine, new studies from Princeton University have showed that as the prevalence of taking notes on laptops has increased, the rate at which students and employees retain information has significantly decreased. Because typing is faster than handwriting notes, the person taking notes will spend less time engaged with the material, which often leads to decreased memory of information.

However, this problem is easily fixable by simply handwriting notes instead of typing them. As Scientific American puts it, we often believe "more is better.' From the number of gigs in a

cellular data plan to the horsepower in a pickup truck" to the notes that we take. However, this is not the case, as the quality of our notes is far more important than the quantity. Due to the slower pace that one has to work when handwriting notes, students and employees are forced to be more selective about what information they pen down. Instead of quickly copying down every bit of information verbatim from your professor or employer, which often happens while typinghandwriting notes allows you to slow down and engage with the content on a deeper level. Handwriting notes gives you more time to contemplate, draw connections between, and synthesize the information presented—which will later aid in remembering the information.

There certainly are benefits to typing. It is an extremely faster way to record information from a class or meeting. Thus, experts suggest that if you truly are a slow writer and the only way you can get the notes down in time is to type them, then you should—but you should then write them down by hand afterward when you are able to work at a slower pace. This way you can still reap the rewards that come from handwriting your notes.

There are many benefits to writing notes by hand. Those who forgo typing their notes are likely to better remember and understand the information learned. Because your brain works hard to selectively copy down specific material, which increases information retention, handwriting notes has been linked to long-term memory benefits.

Additionally, according to a 2014 UCLA study, those who take notes by hand are typically much more proficient at answering conceptual questions and making inferences than those who take notes on a computer or phone. The act of summarizing and paraphrasing information presented by a professor or employer, drastically boosts understanding of the material.

While typing your notes may seem more efficient, it actually proves to be less so in the long run. Handwriting notes will end up saving you time by improving information processing and long-term memory. Therefore, instead of pulling out your laptop the next time you are tasked with writing notes, pull out a piece of paper and handwrite your notes. The little bit of extra time and effort you will use handwriting your notes will have many lasting benefits. You already learned the information once, don't make yourself take the extra time to relearn all of it simply because you typed it and then forgot it.
